



**From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...**

**MY DEAR FRIENDS,**

**Today's Gospel is all about greed and contentions over greed...**



if someone would come to me today with the same request put to Jesus, I would surely point out to him/her the Yellow Pages, with pages filled with lawyers of every sort and specialized law fields. There are two reasons for this great number of lawyers. Actually, I heard that there are more lawyers in our good 'ole USA' than in the entire world combined.

The first reason is the Anglo-Saxon concept and respect of the law: we expect the law to be supreme and binding for all, from the President down to the last citizen. In the Latin countries, especially in the past, the legislator who writes the law, is above the law!

The second reason is that we live in a multi-cultural society of different races, religions and traditions. The only common regulatory bond amongst us is the law, although some laws now and then go against family or religious traditions of a sizeable group of our citizens.

The consequences of all this is that we have become a very litigious society, which, in a sense, has rightfully punished those corporations or individuals that took advantage of the common people for the sake of the bottom line; on the other side, the greed has spread to the new group of ambulance-chasers... for the benefit of few, and the discomfort of many. A side effect of all this is naturally the over-legalistic and paralyzing attitude overshadowing our civic life. What happened to forgiveness and controlling our greed?

"Avoid greed in all its forms," Jesus said, because we Christian disciples can, and did sometimes, succumb to the natural desire of physical or financial security, and of amassing money and possessions. And, then, endless fights and enmities start among us because of property and wealth. Think for a minute of all the fights and splits in your own families. How many were originated because of money, possessions and greed? What are our political divisions mainly based on? How true the Biblical sentence sounds to our ears and hearts. You cannot serve God and money. Think of these two biblical quotes: "Do you know why there are fights among you? Because you greedily desire, and you cannot get what you desire, so you resort to murder. Do not worry about what you will eat, look at the lilies of the fields; they do not sow or reap but your Heavenly Father takes care of them."

The example brought by Jesus about the rich man hoarding possessions, only to relinquish them at his untimely death, recalls the wise cry of Ecclesiastes in the first reading: "Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity," and we can easily identify with His appraisal of our human condition, including our worries and sleepless

nights, which is also vanity. Only God is our strength, our joy, our future... paradise, here we come!

**Next Sunday is Caritas Sunday**, when the members of Caritas (all volunteers) seek your donations at the doors of the church for the needy. Any help you can give to these poor unfortunate souls is an act of charity! Last month we collected the generous amount of \$3,779 at the doors of the church from you dear parishioners. Thank you and please be generous once again this month.

The permits to build the new Caritas mini-office have been presented to the City fathers, or to put it more precisely, the City bureaucrats. As soon as we receive the permits, construction will begin with the hope it will be ready for Christmas.

**OUR ST. MARTHA SCHOOL OPENS ITS DOORS FOR THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR ON WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 10.** Please pray for the staff and children so that these pupils may be well formed as good citizens and excellent disciples of Christ.

The Zazarino Center is almost complete, except for a few items that were late in coming because of the over orders of the factories. But the children will gather in the gym on Wednesday, August 10 and then go into St. Anne's Hall for the Mass. The solemn inauguration of the Zazarino Center will be offered by our Bishop Frank J. Dewane on Monday, September 12. The dinner and dance, a fundraiser to finish paying for the Center, will be held on Saturday, October 22 in St. Anne's Hall.



### Possessions are nothing but an illusion.

In the Parable of the Rich Fool, Jesus said to the crowd, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." (Lk 12:15). Most of the Parables shared by the Lord in Holy Scripture address the issue of possessions and how we treat them, how we use them as a measurement of success. Consistently those who write about the challenges we face in living lives of stewardship point to this same problem. Jesus certainly understood it. Christ was living in a society that was very different from that we experience today, but that basic difficulty existed then, as it does now. The problem is not that possessions exist, but that they can become the dominant motivation in our lives and how we live them. The Lord cautions us, as He does in the Parable of the Rich Fool from today's Gospel, that storing up treasure and possessions means that we may be wealthy in the eyes of society, but not in "what matters to God." This is one of our ongoing stumbling blocks to being stewards living a Christian life. Our Holy Father Pope Francis speaks often about this same problem. In a recent homily he said, "True joy does not come from things or from possessing. It is born from the relationship with others; it is born from feeling accepted, understood, and loved, and from accepting, understanding, and loving. It is saying to one another, 'You are important to me,' not 'What you have is important to me.' Possessions are nothing but an illusion."
