

*From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...*

Our Florida Bishops are very concerned during this coronavirus epidemic. As of Wednesday, March 18 the Florida bishops have ordered all Churches closed so that the epidemic will not spread.

Today is “REJOICE” Sunday, when our Mother the Church reminds us of the joy of giving up to God our sacrifices. It does seem strange to hear about this “Joyful season of Lent” as the preface proclaims. We do associate joy with the Christmas Season, and sadness with Lent: Why be joyful then? For the same reason that the Apostles rejoiced when the members of the Sanhedrin had them flogged; and the Acts of the Apostles (5:41) tells us that the Apostles, “left the presence of the Sanhedrin, Rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name (of Jesus).” We too should Rejoice then, when we answer the Lenten call to suffer for Jesus!

Right now, with the coronavirus epidemic in the entire world, it seems that there is very little cause for rejoicing, but let’s all repeat with Job (2:10) **“The Lord gave and the Lord took away; blessed be the name of the Lord.”** Also, this virus will pass away! Let’s be confident!

Today’s Gospel is another one of those masterpieces of John’s Gospel! We can identify with this blind man. He was not willing to be intimidated by Jesus’ enemies, and not caring to be politically correct, proclaimed fearlessly his faith in our Lord. It is a good example for us, who sometimes are so timid in defending our principles and our God!

During Sundays following Easter, we will use the “Asperges” or Rite of Sprinkling, at the 10:30 a.m. Masses instead of the Penitential rite. The Rite of Sprinkling reminds us of our baptism and with the proper disposition and making the sign of the Cross, our venial sins are forgiven.

During the Easter Season, we Catholics have the obligation to receive Holy Communion. Let us review again the prescribed way to receive Holy Communion: we approach the minister, extending the secondary hand in the form of a cup, and the primary hand underneath. When the minister raises the Blessed Body of Christ saying: “The Body of Christ,” just bow slightly and answer: “Amen.” Then step aside, facing the altar, reverently consume the host, then go to your place and sit or kneel to listen and dialogue with Jesus. Although a genuflection is also our old traditional way of honoring Jesus, I respectfully ask you to be careful in genuflecting in the communion line to avoid tripping anyone coming behind you, an act of charity that Jesus will appreciate, just bow.

Holy Communion can be received twice a day; this is a law given by our late, Saint Pope John Paul II! The Eucharistic Fast, excluding water and medicines, should be observed before Communion, abstaining from any food or drink for at least an hour, unless a person is old or sick. About the obligation to receive Communion once a year, Canon 916 says: “A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive Communion without prior sacramental confession, unless grave reason is present... in this case, a person is to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible.” About the sacrament of Penance, Canon 960 states: “Individual and integral confession and absolution constitute the only ordinary way by which the faithful person who is aware of serious sin is reconciled with God and with the Church.” About the obligation of confession once a year, Canon 989

says: “After having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year.” The obligation of confession is applicable only in the case of grave sins. Venial sins can be forgiven either by communal or private confession, by receiving Holy Communion, by non-sacramental penitential rite (like the one at the beginning of the Mass), by almsgiving, sacrificial actions, acts of charity, or the sign of the cross with Holy water and a contrite heart.

At every Easter I hear again that Jesus was killed by the Jews. For us Catholics, familiar with the Stations of the Cross, we can recognize the Roman legionaries in the stations, not the Jewish army soldiers which were not in existence at the time of Jesus. We Catholics recite at Mass the Creed, the formula of Christian faith. In the Creed three human beings are mentioned: two for our veneration, Mary and Jesus (true God and true man), and one for eternal condemnation and scorn, the Roman governor Pontius Pilate who ordered Jesus’ condemnation to death.

Pope Emeritus, Benedict XVI, changed the 1962 missal’s Good Friday prayer for the Jewish people. “The Holy Father has heard with appreciation the concerns of the Jewish community that the prayers of Good Friday should reflect the relationship between Jews and the Church put forward in ‘Nostra Aetate,’ and implemented by the late Pope John Paul II,” Auxiliary Bishop Richard Sklba of Milwaukee said, recalling the Second Vatican Council declaration on the relation of the Church to non-Christian religions.

“As Vatican II states,” Bishop Sklba continued, ‘God holds the Jews most dear for the sake of their Fathers; He does not repent of the gifts he makes or of the calls he issues, such is the witness of the Apostle.’ The message added: “The Holy Father has chosen to omit from his revision any language from the various editions of the (Latin) Missal of 1962 that have long been associated with negative images of Jews. For example, there are no references to the ‘blindness of the Jews,’ to the ‘lifting of a veil from their heart,’ or to their ‘being pulled from darkness.’

“Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI chose to present the relationship of the Church and the Jews within the mystery of salvation as found in St. Paul’s Letter to the Romans [cf. Rom 11: 11-32]. Central to the concerns of the Holy Father, Pope Benedict, is the clear articulation that salvation comes through faith in Jesus Christ and his Church. It is a faith that must never be imposed but always freely chosen.

“The Catholic Church in the United States,” Bishop Sklba’s message concluded, “remains steadfastly committed to deepening its bonds of friendship and mutual understanding with the Jewish community.” (Courtesy Zenit.org)

Today, we are reminded that Jesus identified himself with our poorest brothers and sisters. My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

My prayer for you and your family is that you will be kept safe from all harm. With the strength that comes from God, I encourage you to support your neighbors and friends with the Hope that is ours in Jesus Christ. Together, we face the threat posed by the COVID-19 outbreak - a crisis that is unprecedented in our lifetime. Still, there is a need to remain flexible and adapt to circumstances, following, as best we can, the guidance of public health officials.

Guidelines have been established that call for further limiting of public gatherings. Therefore, out of pastoral concern for all, and after prayer and discernment, as well as hearing from the priests and the Faithful, I announce that the regularly scheduled Masses and other Liturgical events in Parish Churches in the Diocese of Venice will be suspended from March 20, 2020 until after Easter, when the situation can be re-evaluated. Visitation to Churches to pray is also suspended. Therefore, the Faithful and visitors to the Diocese are dispensed from any obligation to attend Mass during this period.

This is acknowledged as a sacrifice for the Catholic Faithful, who have a great love for the Holy Eucharist and depend on the Most Blessed Sacrament for their spiritual lives. Do recall that Faithful Catholics, throughout the history of the Church, have kept the faith alive through trying times. By prayer and devotion, as well as spiritual solidarity with each other, the life of faith continued to be a source of strength and perseverance during persecutions and other times of public crisis. Tomorrow, on the Feast of St. Joseph, I will dedicate the Diocese of Venice to the care of the Foster Father of Jesus. Let us be united in prayer to St. Joseph for his intercession and protection.

Our Priests have been asked to draw upon the Church's rich tradition of prayer and devotion to ensure that the spiritual life of parishioners is nourished and remains vibrant through means which are prudently adapted to the current circumstances. Our Diocesan website has a list of opportunities to view the celebration of the Holy Mass. Parish websites will also provide other helpful suggestions for how to promote prayerfulness and spiritual communion.

Priests, together with the Catholic Faithful, are asked to make prudent decisions about Weddings and Funerals while observing guidance to limit gatherings. Baptisms will only be celebrated in cases of emergency. The Anointing of the Sick ought to be requested only in genuine need for the dying. Priests are to take the necessary precautions to protect themselves and the Faithful when administering the Sacraments to the Sick (i.e. the use of isolation gowns, masks and gloves, as well as following the guidelines of medical professionals). All Confirmations prior to Easter have been postponed, along with penance services. Parish and social events, as well as ministry gatherings, are also suspended. Parishioners, in the event of emergency situations, are invited to communicate with a Priest, Deacon or available staff by phone, or by email.

As your Bishop, I am always edified and grateful for the generosity of the Faithful, particularly at difficult times. Of course, you must consider your own circumstances and how the Coronavirus outbreak has impacted your family. However, it is also necessary to provide for the ministry of the Church, as well as continue to serve the poor and the vulnerable through Catholic Charities. The Catholic Faithful are humbly asked to continue their generous support for our Parishes, Schools, Catholic Charities and the Diocese.

My dear Faithful, be confident that Christ is with us always and that the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph are interceding for us. Take courage and trust in God during this time of many challenges.

A Charitable Gift Annuity is a contract between the donor and the Catholic Community Foundation, whereby the donor receives a partial tax deduction with fixed payments for the rest of their life in exchange for a gift of cash or securities. 7. Legit company links match legitimate URLs

What to Do If You Receive a Phishing Attempt:

- **Do not open it.** In some cases, the act of opening the phishing email may cause you to compromise the security of your Personally Identifiable Information
- **Delete it immediately** to prevent yourself from accidentally opening the message in the future.
- **Do not download any attachments** accompanying the message. Attachments may contain malware such as viruses, worms or spyware.
- **Never click links** that appear in the message. Links embedded within phishing messages direct you to fraudulent websites.
- **Do not reply**
