From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...



Our beloved Bishop Frank J. Dewane has sent us a pastoral letter with deep suggestions for our considerations:

“Over the past weeks, there has been civil unrest in response to the death of George Floyd and the suffering caused by racism in the United States. Anger and frustration are felt by many, and countless protests are evidenced in cities throughout the country and the world. At the same time, the Church encourages peaceful response and prays for an end to racism.

The Church and Church leaders also have an important role in confronting the sin of racism. Responding to the call to defend human dignity, the Church must raise Her voice against every instance of the evil of racism. I add my voice and condemn racism in all its forms.

As the Church will be celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, it is necessary that we, as the Body of Christ, speak also about the suffering of so many.”

In November 2018 the Catholic bishops of the United States released a Pastoral Letter Against Racism called, **Open Wide Our Hearts**. The letter is a powerful invitation for all the people of God to “face courageously the sin of racism, . . . reach out generously to the victims of this evil, to assist the conversion needed in those who still harbor racism, and to begin to change policies and structures that allow racism to persist.” At uscbb.org/racism, you can read the entire letter, get resources and find ideas for how we can respond.

And I quote from the letter:

Through his Cross and Resurrection, Christ united the one human race to the Father. However, even though Christ’s victory over sin and death is complete, we still live in a world affected by them.

Racism arises when - either consciously or unconsciously - a person holds that his or her own race or ethnicity is superior, and therefore judges persons of other races or ethnicities.

Racism can often be found in our hearts - in many cases placed there unwillingly or unknowingly by our upbringing and culture.

What is needed, and what we are calling for, is a genuine conversion of heart, a conversion that will compel change, and the reform of our institutions and society.

In this regard, each of us should adopt the words of Pope Francis as our own: let no one “think that this invitation is not meant for him or her.”

You have been told...what the LORD requires of you: Only to do justice and to love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God. (Mi 6:8)

Today we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi (Latin: “The Body of Christ”) and so we meditate on that most intimate mystery when, at the Last Supper, Jesus: **“Took bread and, giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, take this, all of you and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you.”** And likewise the cup, after they had eaten, saying, **“...This is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.”** (Lk 22:19-20)

There are many basic commandments that Jesus left all of us, and of the two most loved commands, the

first one is to love one another as He loved us (Jn 15:22), and the second one is to be together with Jesus at Mass: “Do this in my memory.”

We know that there is no doubt, that the single, most visible sign and commitment of our Christian faith is the Mass. Since Christ’s Resurrection, the Apostles (Cor 11:17-32) got together to celebrate a memorial supper, on the weekly anniversary of Jesus’ Resurrection, to obey His command (Lk 22:19): **“Do this in my memory.”** The celebration of the Mass, or Eucharist, is: “The true center of the whole Christian life, both for the universal Church, and for the local congregation” (Vat.II pg. 106). In the Eucharist, we become one with Christ, who said: **“I am the living bread that came down from Heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever, and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the world”** (Jn 6:51). This millenarian tradition of the Christian people is a serious obligation, as the official Church law reminds us (CIC #1247): “On Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass; they are also to abstain from those labors and business concerns which impede the worship to be rendered to God, the joy which is proper to the Lord’s day or the proper relaxation of mind and body.”


But, you may ask, why did Jesus do this? And how is it possible that the immensity of God can be contained in a piece of bread or a drop of wine? We do not grasp the ways of God, but we do accept God’s word **“This is my Body,”** and St. Paul reminds us (1Cor 11:23-29) that we should approach the Eucharistic Mystery with the utmost respect: **“for anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the BODY, eats and drinks judgment on himself.”**

Perhaps I think that we can have a small glimpse into God’s mind when we think that we are made of body and soul, and Jesus is getting “physical” with us, in His glorious **Humanity and Divinity!** Wow! Only a God could have thought of it!

For a few precious minutes after communion, we are in a state of total union with Jesus, such as we will experience again only in Paradise. We are on the top of the world! Let us not waste the time after Communion – a time of silence, adoration, awe and loving communications with God – in daydreaming or trying to sneak out into the parking lot to beat the Catholic stampede.

I personally glow inside my soul during the silent thanksgiving after communion, and I am ready at that time to lick the entire world and the devil himself - if God is with me, who cares about anyone going against me? Jesus does communicate Himself to us at communion; let us listen and bring Him and His message to the world outside.

Friday is the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It does seem strange for a non-Catholic this emphasis on a heart, but it is not so far-fetched as it seems, after all what is the symbol of lovers on Valentine’s Day? The heart! And what better symbol of God’s love may we Catholics have, besides the Cross, than the Heart of Jesus? Appearing in 1673-75 to a French nun, Jesus pointed to His Heart, wounded by the lance of the Roman Centurion, and exclaimed: **“This is the Heart that has so much loved mankind, but only receives rejection and scorn!”** In these liturgical days after Easter, we Catholics meditate, and make again a commitment to these divine symbols:





1. **The Flame of Pentecost**, symbol of a God passionately in love with us.
2. **The Triangle of the Trinity**, symbol of our call to a loving relationship with God and with each other.
3. **The Body of Christ**, symbol of our total (body and soul) communion with God.
4. **The Sacred Heart of Jesus**, symbol of the greatest love the world has ever known.
5. **The Immaculate Heart of Mary**, symbol of the feminine and motherly facet of our loving and tender God! By the way, this Saturday we celebrate Mary's Heart, wounded by the sword of Jesus' Passion.
6. **The Precious Blood**, where we are bathed and immersed, symbol of our all-forgiving God.

In closing, let us thank God the Father of all human beings, protect us from all harm in this epidemic, and give strength to our first responders, police, firefighters, and medical personnel!

Updated Guidelines for Masses at St. Martha Church June 4, 2020

1. The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is dispensed through the end of June 2020.
2. Whenever there is a public gathering nowadays, there is a risk for anyone to contract coronavirus, so use prudence and, if concerned or fearful, please follow Holy Mass on TV or on the web.
3. The public celebration of the Holy Mass will resume Monday, May 18, 2020 and moving forward.
4. A facemask should be worn by all parishioners and Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Communion during Mass.
5. Observe the social distancing of 6' between people (not living in the same household), and the total capacity rule of 50% of occupancy of the Church and Hall: (34) total seating stations in the Church and (72) total seating stations in the Parish Hall.
6. All missals, songbooks, missalettes, bulletins, and prayer cards must be removed from the pews. No Holy Water at the doors.
7. No physical contact at the "Our Father" or at the optional "Sign of Peace" (a simple bow with eye contact is sufficient).
8. All persons, as defined by the Health Department, as more vulnerable, such as 65+ years of age, those with underlying health conditions, fever or flu-like symptoms are encouraged to stay at home, however attendance is at their discretion. A weekend Mass will be available every Sunday on our website (stmartha.org) and You Tube channel (St. Martha Catholic Church Sarasota, FL).
9. Priests and Deacons will not greet you, dear parishioners, entering or leaving the Church, eliminating the temptations of touching or hugging.
10. Holy Communion will be dropped in the cup of your hand only. We prefer that the Eucharistic Ministers go the parishioners' seats.
11. If the Hall is fully occupied or you are unable to attend Holy Mass, Communion will be distributed by the Deacons at the Confessional window in the courtyard on Saturdays, from 4-4:30 p.m. and 5:30-6 p.m.; on Sundays, from 7:30-8am, 9-9:30 a.m., 10:30-11 a.m., 12-12:30 p.m., and 5:30-6 p.m.
12. Daily Masses, Monday - Friday (7:30 a.m., 8:30 a.m., 12 p.m., and 5:30 p.m.) and Saturday (7:30 a.m. and 8:30 a.m.) will be celebrated in the Church. The Saturday vigil and Sunday Masses will be celebrated ONLY in the Parish Hall, because of its greater capacity. Saturday vigil Masses are 4 p.m. and 5:30 p.m.; Sunday Masses are 7:30 a.m., 9 a.m., 10:30 a.m., 12 p.m. (in Vietnamese), and 5:30 p.m.
13. Individual Confessions will take place at the Confessional window in the courtyard Sunday - Friday, 11:30 a.m. - 12 p.m.; Saturday 9 - 10 a.m. and 3 - 4 p.m.
14. Only baskets with long handles will be used for collections, but the Mass will continue because there is no procession with gifts.
15. Marriages, Baptisms, and Funerals may resume following the general rules of 50% capacity and the 6 feet social distancing between people not living in the same household.
16. Communal Celebration of the Anointing of the Sick after the 8:30 a.m. Mass on Saturdays is suspended. The Adoration Chapel continues to be closed. All organized Parish activities are suspended except for the Sacred Liturgy.
17. All Deacons and Priests above the age of 70 will not preside at Masses or minister to you unless they receive special dispensation from the Bishop, the reason is to safeguard your good health from vulnerable elderlies.

In conjunction with the Catholic Community Foundation, parishioners can name St. Martha as the beneficiary of a Charitable Gift Annuity. A Charitable Gift Annuity is a great way to support St. Martha, while at the same time, generating a guaranteed life-long income for you, the donor.

A Charitable Gift Annuity is a contract between the donor and the Catholic Community Foundation, whereby the donor receives a partial tax deduction with fixed payments for the rest of their life in exchange for a gift of cash or securities. The money remaining in the account at the end of their life is given to St. Martha.

The annuity contract uses rates based on age, life expectancy and assumed investment returns, which are intended to produce a final gift to St. Martha of 50% of the original funding amount.




