

**From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...**

Attention: last week our bulletin production company, Diocesan Publications, made a mistake with a link in the bulletin. In the Candidate Questionnaire Project, the link was supposed to direct readers to the Florida Council of Catholic Bishops website, but instead connected to a Donald Trump campaign website. The publication company apologizes to the priests, the staff and parishioners of St. Martha. The mistake has been corrected. As a pastor, I am pastor of the Democrats the Republicans, the Independents and the nonvoters. Please accept the apology from Diocesan Publication, as they assure us this mistake will never happen again.

**Dear friends, news is appearing fast in our times. Some important ones are:**

1. An invitation by the bishop to restart our Parish activities, and attendance to Church liturgies, in so far as wearing face mask and reduced social distance is kept. More norms will follow, so stay tuned to our church bulletin.
2. Papal Proclamation of a worldwide Rosary Sunday to end the pandemic.
3. New Papal encyclical FRATELLI TUTTI to renew the bond of love in all of us Catholics, people of love and light!
4. Extension of the Sunday obligation by our bishop to Sunday, Nov. 27 and probably beyond this date.
5. Special prayer for the success to make a vaccine against Coronavirus.

The present pandemic of the Coronavirus, with its mutations has befuddled the scientific and medical community and dashed any hope of a fast resolution and early demise of the COVID-19 virus. In March I had hope of returning to normality within six months, but we are now in our seventh month with no light at the end of the tunnel.

I would like to make a report on our Mass attendance. Plenty of room in Church during the weekly Masses. As for the weekends, the Saturday 4 p.m. and the Sunday 9 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and Noon Masses are full or almost. As long as the safe distance is in effect, we cannot make room for more people. The bishops decided to dispense with the Sunday obligation and we priests and deacons in St. Martha, use the TV and the web for all parishioners to have a chance to live Sunday with Jesus; using Spiritual Communion during the web Mass, or the confessional window in the garden to receive the Blessed Sacrament has been in effect, especially for people who drive to church but cannot enter because all seats are occupied. Very likely, as we have already done last Sunday at the 10:30 a.m. Mass, we can add a Mass for the overflow of the Hall in the Church.

Another concern is the music. I've seen an experiment made of singing choristers or talking lectors while wearing masks. The study shows that in either action, a cloud of big and small saliva particles are projected up to 3-6 feet while reading and up to 8-10 feet when singing at full volume. Then I understood why the Bishop did not allow the choir to be used. Our Ginny Bray can use the piano and a cantor in the Hall for Masses, as some parishioners desire. After all, those who sing, St. Augustine said, pray twice. But singing creates a larger saliva

cloud, especially with those common face masks we use. Also, we must keep Masses shorter so that chairs or pews could be disinfected after each Mass, and have some time to take effect before parishioners come for the next Mass: singing lengthens the Mass. Let's play it by ear.

Today's Gospel should be proclaimed on the Sunday before April 15 because it does touch our Christian responsibilities to the government, among them the payment of taxes. In this electoral campaign the topic of taxes has been hotly debated.

There is a good lesson to learn from today's Gospel which, by the way, shows the mounting hatred of the sect of Pharisees - now strangely allied with their political enemies the Herodians - toward Jesus. The Rabbi who wrote the Gospel of Matthew was a disciple of the former tax collector and probably patterned his gospel on the original Aramaic of his Master, which was providential for us because the original was lost. It was the only writing of the new testament not written in the common Greek which, although not as pure as the Athenian Greek, was the commerce language of the Mediterranean Basin, comparable to the "pidgin" English of today, vis-à-vis the Oxford English. As a Rabbi converted to Christ, the author of Matthew wanted to inspire us to civil obedience toward the government, even if a heathen one! To "pay taxes" becomes a duty, and it is the will of God, separating the sacred sphere from the profane. St. Peter had already made this civil obedience before Matthew. So, my dear friends, a good Christian is a good citizen, who does not steal (cheating on taxes is stealing) or create dissensions, or refuse military service, but one who drives carefully and obeys the law of the land: "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, but give to God what is God's."

As you well know, October is Respect Life month, and Forty Days for Life continues until November 1. The mission of the campaign is to bring together the body of Christ in a spirit of unity through prayer, fasting, and peaceful activism. You are encouraged to pray for life from birth until natural death, and you can walk for life at the Planned Parenthood facility on Central Avenue. A young lady offered me this poem as a sign of her repentance:

I anxiously await the moment my soul is reunited with yours; the decision I made long ago deserves the pain which my heart endures. Reparation I cannot achieve for the vile sin I did commit; my loss and grief has no face that I know. I made my choice, now I live with it. At the time it seemed acceptable, many opinions were cast my way; support for my choice was all around, but God would not approve of that day. It is hard to accept forgiveness; memories are hard to surrender; I know what I did was very wrong; my penance lives as I remember. People are given many chances. God gives many blessings from above; sometimes gifts are taken for granted, a child symbolizes God's love.

Today, is World Mission Sunday (Propagation of the Faith). Jesus Himself directed His followers to go into the whole world and proclaim His Gospel - the "Good News" of His love for us - to all peoples (see Mark 16:15). That mission is now directed to each one of us. On World Mission Sunday, we have the opportunity to be part of the Church's missionary work. Your generosity through the Propagation of the Faith


On Thursday, October 22 we commemorate the life of St. John Paul II, one of the greatest popes in modern time. Karol Jozef Wojtyla was born in 1920 in Wadowice, Poland. As archbishop of Krakow, he took part in the Second Vatican Council. On October 16, 1978, he was elected pope and took the name John Paul II. His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people, and the sick, led him to make numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. He left as a heritage to the Church a rich Magisterium and the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the revised Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church and Eastern Churches, and the third typical edition of the *Roman Missal*. Pope John Paul II departed peacefully in the Lord on April 2, 2005. Pope Francis canonized him on April 27, 2014. *“O God, who are rich in mercy and who willed that Saint John Paul the Second should preside as Pope over your universal Church, grant, we pray, that instructed by his teaching, we may open our hearts to the saving grace of Christ, the sole Redeemer of mankind. Who lives and reigns...”*







What is a Payable on Death (POD) beneficiary designation?

A Payable on Death (POD) account designation allows for the money remaining in the account when the account owner dies to pass directly to a beneficiary named by the account owner. POD beneficiary designation can be setup for checking, savings, money market, certificate of deposit and brokerage accounts.

While the owner of the POD account is alive, the beneficiary named by the owner will not have any access to or control over the POD account. By naming St. Martha as a POD beneficiary, the remaining balance of the account will transfer to St. Martha at the account owner's death. Setting up a POD beneficiary does not require a change to your will or trust.




