From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...

With The first Sunday of Advent (coming of Jesus) the new liturgical year begins. The Holy readings of the Sunday Mass will follow the Year B, and for the weekday Masses will follow the Cycle I.

Today's Gospel brings again our attention to our own death more than to Jesus' second coming. We know that death can come at any moment and the good Lord, as a Jewish man, did not know Himself when His second coming and the collective judgment of all human beings, living and dead, would come; therefore He desired to make us aware about the unpredictability of death. How strange it is that the most certain fact of life, which is the end of our lives (death), is also the most uncertain happening for us. We do not know exactly how, where or when we will die. Only those condemned to a capital execution know their date of death. In fatal illnesses the doctors can give an approximate date, but no certain, exact hour of death comes. Even so, we are so afraid of death and the consequent, horrible decay of our flesh, that we sometimes even refuse to talk about death.

But if I ask, during my sermon, "Do you want to go to Paradise? Do you want to die now and go to Paradise?" The answers have always been "yes" to paradise and "no" to die now; naturally it is illogical, but understandable; we do hate sudden happenings in our daily activities. As fallible human beings, we must plan our future moves and to die now, without preparation for death, is understandably upsetting for all of us. The Good Lord knows this human trait well, of course, and that is why we read in the Bible the command given to King Hezekiah, by God, through the Prophet Isaiah: "Put your house in order, for you are about to die; you will not recover" (2 Kgs 20:1).

But with or without preparation, we will die; we cannot say to death: "Wait a minute..."

For this reason, Jesus reminds us to be watchful. **Never ever** live with a mortal sin on your soul! Once we realize that we have fallen into a mortal sin, let's tell Jesus how sorry we are for having offended God and let us go to a priest for confession and hear with our own ears the consoling words: "You are all forgiven, go in peace!" In this way, we're ready with the light of faith shining bright in our hearts when the bridegroom arrives to open the doors of Paradise for us (Mt 25: 1-13). Alleluia!

We are still in the 2nd (or is it the 3rd?) wave of the epidemic and, blessedly we are seeing some light at the end of the tunnel, with two vaccines already on the way to be approved for distribution! What a miracle to have a vaccine ready in only six months: only in America! Let's keep our guard up until the vaccines have done their job!

Even though Advent is just starting, and the pandemic is still ferocious, we see the Christmas decorations and we hear the Christmas music already... The problem is that now the season of Advent has lost its character of relieving the anxious waiting for the Messiah by the prophets of old. But this commercial and festive development of our

times cannot obscure the other meaning of Advent; our spiritual preparation for the **second coming of Jesus**, when all nations on earth will see the **Son of Man** coming in the clouds, to judge the living and the dead. The Advent wreath, which we light every Sunday of Advent, makes us aware that Jesus' light is coming to the world, growing stronger by the passing of time: one day this light will bathe the earth with the glorious information to mankind of the second coming. By the way, our information age is making us instantly aware of all the happenings around the world; we have truly become a global village. It is apparent to all of us that crime and evil make news, and, when we live in an age where news is reported instantly and extensively, our perception of the magnitude of evil is multiplied as is our disgust, anxieties, and powerlessness. No wonder that many minds get disturbed and wonder and agonize about Jesus' prophecy and power, without realizing that He told us that He will be with us always: "**Yes, until the end of the world!**" Jesus said! Let us raise up our teary and tired eyes; in a short while our reward will come upon us! On that day, Jesus will come again to judge the living and the dead, and to make a new world, destroying the old structures of evil and injustice! I pray that all of us will meditate often on the words of Jesus: "Stay awake! You do not know when the appointed time will come! ... What I say to you, I say to all: be on guard!" (Mk 13:33 & 37). Your spiritual energy in prayer, and in converting from sin to Jesus all the sinners, especially those whom we know well, is needed.

Next Sunday is Caritas Sunday, when the members of Caritas (all volunteers) seek your donations at the doors of the Church. Please help them with your contributions so they can continue to assist persons and or families in need in our area. This past month you donated \$1,816.32 at our church doors. We sincerely thank you for your contributions!

Tuesday, December 1, is World AIDS Day. This is a day set aside nationally to help us remember the hundreds of thousands of people infected with HIV/AIDS. Today we are remembering all of those people in a special way in the prayers in each of our Masses. We pray also for God's help in eradicating this disease from the face of the earth. Keep also, in your generous hearts our people with AIDS/HIV who are assisted by us at Bethesda House on 4th Street. Let's be merciful and not judgmental, as Jesus came not to condemn, but to save!

More from Pope Francis' encyclical, "Fratelli Tutti": The theme of the fifth chapter is "*A better kind of politics*", which represents one of the most valuable forms of charity because it is placed at the service of the common good (180) and recognizes the importance of people, understood as an open category, available for discussion and dialogue (160). In a certain sense, this is the populism indicated by Francis, which counters that "populism" which ignores the legitimacy of the notion of "people", by attracting consensus in order to exploit them for its own service and fomenting selfishness in order to increase its own popularity (159). But a better politics is also one that protects **work**, an "essential dimension

of social life”, and seeks to ensure everyone the opportunity to develop their own abilities (162). **The best help to a poor person, the Pontiff explains, is not just money, which is a provisional remedy, but rather allowing him or her to have a dignified life through work.** The true anti-poverty strategy does not simply aim to contain or render indigents inoffensive, but to promote them in the perspective of solidarity and subsidiarity (187). The task of politics, moreover, is to find a solution to all that attacks fundamental human rights, such as social exclusion; the marketing of organs, tissues, weapons and drugs; sexual exploitation; slave labour; terrorism and organized crime. The Pope makes an emphatic appeal to definitively eliminate human trafficking, a “source of shame for humanity”, and hunger, which is “criminal” because food is “an inalienable right” (188-189).

The priests are having their Convocation Day on Wednesday, Dec. 2nd at the Cathedral. On this day, there will be no confession at 11:30 a.m. and the Noon Mass will be a Communion Service. Please pray for our priests who will convene for a general assembly of prayer and study and planning under the hands of our Bishop Frank J. Dewane.

As no one is coming to receive Holy Communion through the Confessional window on Sunday mornings at 7:30 a.m., it will no longer be distributed at this time. Holy Communion will continue to be distributed Saturdays 4-4:30 p.m. and 5:30-6 p.m. and Sundays 9-9:30 a.m., 10:30-11 a.m., 12-12:30 p.m., and 5:30 - 6 p.m.

A Charitable Gift Annuity is a contract between the donor and the Catholic Community Foundation, whereby the donor receives a partial tax deduction with fixed payments for the rest of their life in exchange for a gift of cash or securities. The money remaining in the account at the end of their life is given to St. Martha.

The annuity contract uses rates based on age, life expectancy and assumed investment returns, which are intended to produce a final gift to St. Martha of 50% of the original funding amount.

As we are spending more time at home and on the internet during this epidemic, criminals see this as a perfect time for email scams. Keep in mind these 7 ways to help avoid being taken advantage of:

1. Legit companies usually call you by your name
2. Legit companies have domain emails
3. Legit companies know how to spell
4. Legit companies don't force you to their website
5. Legit companies don't send unsolicited attachments
6. Legit company links match legitimate URLs
7. Legit companies don't request your sensitive information via email

What to Do If You Receive a Phishing Attempt:

- **Do not open it.** In some cases, the act of opening the phishing email may cause you to compromise the security of your Personally Identifiable Information
- **Delete it immediately** to prevent yourself from accidentally opening the message in the future.
- **Do not download any attachments** accompanying the message. Attachments may contain malware such as viruses, worms or spyware.
- **Never click links** that appear in the message. Links embedded within phishing messages direct you to fraudulent websites.
- **Do not reply**
