

*From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...
My Dear Friends,*

Alleluia! In nine months we Americans, prodded by our President Trump, went from no vaccine to distribution! Only in the USA! Thank you Jesus and Mother Mary. When the pandemic exploded and we closed our church on March 18, I, at least, hoped that we were going to be in quarantine times maybe for 2-3 months. Maybe for Easter Sunday or the Holy Week, I secretly hoped and prayed that we could be open. How foolish was I. And now even Christmas will be under the shadow of the pandemic, and, even if our churches are open, the rule of the safe distance is still in effect.

We your priests and deacons, are offering 18 Christmas Masses between the Church and Hall. Please feel free to come and get the Christmas experience again and receive Holy Communion, telling Jesus how much we love Him with all our hearts. I pray that you, dear parishioners, will find some room in both Church and Hall, to feel the joyful spirit of Christmas. I am begging all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to serve Jesus' body to the parishioners who drive here but can not find room, so at least they can receive Jesus, and not go back home dejected, cheerless and downcast! The best Christmas gift a Eucharistic Minister can give, is the gift of Jesus' body to our parishioners, thirsting for God.

Friday is Christmas Day! Merry Christmas to all of you parishioners who will be away from the St. Martha's Family Celebration!

Today's Gospel recounts the fateful encounter of the Archangel Gabriel with an obscure Jewish maiden in a forgotten corner of the mighty Roman Empire during the reign of the first Roman Emperor, Cesar Augustus, supposedly in the year 752 of the Roman calendar, which had its beginning from the foundation of Rome by Romulus. I said "supposedly" because such calculation is a mistake made in the year 532 A.D. when a Rumanian Monk, and canonist, Dionysius Exiguus (the "skinny"), calculated the year of Jesus' birth, so to substitute the Roman calendar (Ab Urbe Condita) with the Christian calendar, which starts with Jesus' birth as year one.

Dionysius calculated Jesus' birth as dated 752-753 AUC. The mistake was found later when other historians found out that King Herod, who tried to kill the baby Jesus, died in the year 748-749 AUC, which means 4 years before Christ. If we calculate that Jesus was alive before Herod died, and even admitting that he was at least one year old, then Jesus was born at least 5 B.C. But the date is not as important as the reality of Jesus' birth, and it was the final answer of Mary, "Let it be done to me as you say," which did cause our salvation. Our school children ask me many times: "Did God choose someone else who refused?" or "Why Mary out of the million Jewish virgins before her?" My answer is always the same: "I do not know." So instead of fantasizing on this fact, let us rejoice that the prophecy was fulfilled that a virgin would be with child, as a sign that Jesus is the son of God. Let us learn from Mary to say yes to God in our thoughts, words and actions!

I conclude the explanation of the Encyclical Fratelli Tutti (All Are Siblings) with this last part of such papal document:

Guarantee religious freedom, a fundamental human right. In the eighth and final chapter, the Pontiff focuses on "Religions at the service of fraternity in our world" and again emphasizes that violence has no basis in religious convictions, but rather in their deformities. Thus, "deplorable" acts, such as acts of terrorism, are not due to religion but to erroneous interpretations of religious texts, as well as "policies linked to hunger, poverty,

injustice, oppression". Terrorism must not be supported with either money or weapons, much less with media coverage, because it is an international crime against security and world peace, and as such must be condemned (282-283). At the same time the Pope underscores that a journey of peace among religions is possible and that it is therefore necessary to guarantee religious freedom, a fundamental human right for all believers (279). The Encyclical reflects, in particular, on the role of the Church: she does not "restrict her mission to the private sphere", it states. She does not remain at the margins of society and, while not engaging in politics, however, she does not renounce the political dimension of life itself. Attention to the common good and concern for integral human development, in fact, concern humanity, and all that is human concerns the Church, according to evangelical principals (276-278). Lastly, reminding religious leaders of their role as "authentic mediators" who expend themselves in order to build peace, Francis quotes the "Document on Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together", which he signed on 4 February 2019 in Abu Dhabi, along with the Grand Imam of Al-Azhar, Ahmad Al-Tayyib: from that milestone of interreligious dialogue, the Pontiff returns to the appeal that, in the name of human fraternity, dialogue be adopted as the way common cooperation as conduct, and mutual knowledge as method and standard (285).



As we are spending more time at home and on the internet during this epidemic, criminals see this as a perfect time for email scams. Keep in mind these 7 ways to help avoid being taken advantage of:

1. Legit companies usually call you by your name
2. Legit companies have domain emails
3. Legit companies know how to spell
4. Legit companies don't force you to their website
5. Legit companies don't send unsolicited attachments
6. Legit company links match legitimate URLs
7. Legit companies don't request your sensitive information via email

What to Do If You Receive a Phishing Attempt:

- **Do not open it.** In some cases, the act of opening the phishing email may cause you to compromise the security of your Personally Identifiable Information
- **Delete it immediately** to prevent yourself from accidentally opening the message in the future.
- **Do not download any attachments** accompanying the message. Attachments may contain malware such as viruses, worms or spyware.
- **Never click links** that appear in the message. Links embedded within phishing messages direct you to fraudulent websites.
- **Do not reply**
