

#### From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...

#### My Dear Friends,

Almost 40 million of us in our USA have been vaccinated. We pray that all of us here and abroad will continue this way and so we will enjoy our full freedom of work, life and prayer.

According to Bill Donahue, Catholic League President, on February 8, Pope Francis said "it was painful" to observe that "under the pretext of guaranteeing presumed subjective rights, a growing number of legal systems in our world seem to be moving away from their inalienable duty to protect human life at every one of its phases." Calling the right to life "a foundational human right," the Holy Father said, "If we deprive the weakest among us of the right to life, how can we effectively guarantee respect for every other right?"

Among those other rights, he noted in a separate forum, is the right to be free from exploitation. He pointedly mentioned the plight of those who suffer from human trafficking, the most vulnerable among us. He encouraged all of us to continue "praying and fighting together" in hopes of ridding ourselves of this horrendous condition.

Unfortunately, today in the United States we are going backwards on both issues. Let us pray that we Catholics, will be the first ones to obey our supreme pontiff.

Lenten season has started. Today is the First Sunday of Lent. Let us make it holy by our sacrifices and prayers so that on Good Friday, when we kneel down to (if the pandemic is over) kiss Jesus on the Cross, we will feel that we have fulfilled His command: "If you want to be my disciples, pick up your cross everyday and follow me." Remember that Masses are at 7:30 a.m., 8:30 a.m., Noon, and 5:30 p.m. each weekday, and Stations of the Cross during Lent are on Fridays at 9 a.m. following the 8:30 a.m. Mass. Please keep the safe distance and the mask, remaining in your pew.

Although Mark is very brief on the subject, the Gospel today is presenting how the Devil tempts the followers of Jesus:

- 1. Through our bodies' weaknesses (hunger, alcohol, sex, drugs).
- 2. Through doubts about God's power.
- 3. Through an inversion of divinity: asking us to have material abundance in selling our souls to the devil through satanic or magic cults.

With Jesus it is easy to say NO! Temptations are occasions either of failure, when our relationship to God becomes cold, or of triumph, if we stick with Jesus! Let us triumph with Jesus over the devil; and if we fail, let us joyfully receive Jesus' forgiveness in confession (Sunday through Friday: 11:30 a.m. to Noon; Saturday 9 a.m. to 10 a.m., and 3 p.m. - 4 pm.)

The First Sunday of Lent traditionally marks the ritual for adults called the Rite of Election. The ritual where, with the Bishop at Epiphany Cathedral at 2 p.m., the Catechumens (those who have not been Baptized) become the Elect, and continue their journey to the Easter Vigil, where they will receive all three sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Also included in this service with Bishop Dewane are the Candidates, those who are preparing to receive Confirmation and/or Eucharist at the Easter Vigil, coming into full membership within the Catholic Community. We pray for the Catechumens, Candidates, Sponsors and the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) team as they enter into this Lenten season and make final preparations for the Easter Vigil Liturgy on April 4.

We have received from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops the following decree:

In accord with the norms established by the Holy See, the following text is declared to be the definitive approved English translation of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, no. 54, and is promulgated by authority of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops:

The Collect

54. Next the Priest calls upon the people to pray and everybody, together with the Priest, observes a brief silence so that they may become aware of being in God's presence and may call to mind their intentions. Then the Priest pronounces the prayer usually called the "Collect" and through which the character of the celebration finds expression. By an ancient tradition of the Church, the Collect prayer is usually addressed to God the Father, through Christ, in the Holy Spirit,56 and is concluded with Trinitarian ending, or longer ending, in the following manner:

If the prayer is directed to the Father: Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever;

If it is directed to the Father, but the Son is mentioned at the end: Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever;

If it is directed to the Son: Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

The people, joining in this petition, make the prayer their own by means of the acclamation *Amen*.

At Mass only a single Collect is ever said.

The revised text of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, no. 54, was canonically approved by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops on January 29, 2021, and was subsequently confirmed by the Apostolic See by a letter of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments on February 3, 2021 (Prot. n. 228/20)

The above texts of the concluding formulas enter into use as of Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021. From that date forward, no other English translation of these texts may be used in the dioceses of the United States of America.


