

*From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...***My Dear Friends,**

**At the moment I'm writing this bulletin, our state recorded two deaths with 5,555 new Covid cases.** A new vaccine (Johnson & Johnson) has been approved. But on this same date, March 2, 2021 Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades of Fort Wayne-South Bend, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Doctrine, and Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City in Kansas, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued a statement on the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine recently approved for use in the United States:

"The approval of Johnson & Johnson's COVID-19 vaccine for use in the United States again raises questions about the moral permissibility of using vaccines developed, tested, and/or produced with the help of abortion-derived cell lines.

Pfizer and Moderna's vaccines raised concerns because an abortion-derived cell line was used for testing them, but not in their production. The Johnson & Johnson vaccine, however, was developed, tested and is produced with abortion-derived cell lines raising additional moral concerns. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith has judged that 'when ethically irreproachable Covid-19 vaccines are not available ... *it is morally acceptable to receive Covid-19 vaccines that have used cell lines from aborted fetuses in their research and production process.*' [1] However, if one can choose among equally safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines, the vaccine with the least connection to abortion-derived cell lines should be chosen. Therefore, if one has the ability to choose a vaccine, Pfizer or Moderna's vaccines should be chosen over Johnson & Johnson's.

While we should continue to insist that pharmaceutical companies stop using abortion-derived cell lines, given the world-wide suffering that this pandemic is causing, we affirm again that being vaccinated can be an act of charity that serves the common good."

**Today is "Laetare" Sunday, the second and last day (the first is the 3rd Sunday of Advent) of the Catholic Liturgical Calendar when the color of the clergy vestments is rose.** I know that we are conditioned by our mass media (Mary Kay... Pink Panther ...) and we wonder why this color, just in the middle of the somber purple color of Lent and Advent. The reason is that our Mother, the Church, wants us to be aware that our period of penance will come to an end, and not to get discouraged by our failure to keep up our Lenten Sacrifices.

We are all sinners from the Pope down: "*If we say 'we are without sin,' we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.*" (1 John 1:8).

How sad is the reality of sin around us! St. Peter admonishes us: "*Be sober and vigilant. Your opponent, the devil, is prowling around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour.*" (1 Peter 5:8) "*The devil tries to destroy in a special way the clergymen, the shepherd of the flock, as Jesus reminded us: 'strike the shepherd and the sheep will be dispersed.'*" (Mk 14:27) When that happens, there is so much anger, confusion and sadness! And what a tall order is the vision of Bishop Polycarp, who wrote 70 years after Jesus' Resurrection:

"Priests should be sympathetic and merciful to everyone, bringing back those who have wandered, visiting the sick; they must not neglect widows and orphans, or the poor, ever providing for what is good in the sight of God and of men.

They should refrain entirely from anger and prejudice; avarice should be wholly alien to them. Nor should they be rash in believing something said against another, nor too severe in judging others, since they know that we are all debtors through sin. If then, we pray to the Lord to forgive us, we must in turn forgive. For we live under the eye of our Lord and God, and we must all stand before the judgment seat of God, each to give an account of himself."

Please, dear sisters and brothers, pray for us deacons, priests, bishops, and religious so that we may be faithful followers of our merciful Shepherd Jesus, whose teaching on God's universal forgiveness is mirrored in the dialogue of Jesus with Nicodemus, who goes to see Jesus at night, in today's Gospel.

**In the masterpiece conversation in John's Gospel, John assures us: "God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world (humankind) might be saved through Him."** It is this amazing grace (a gift) of God that saves us. It is an action, started by God and completed by our positive response, that opens the door of paradise for us, allowing us to live eternally, forever. This eternal life will be not just on the soul, but also on our risen bodies, after Jesus' second coming.

There is no room for despair in us, the believers in Jesus, because even if we are immersed in sin, we firmly rejoice in His assurance: "*Whoever believes in Him avoids condemnation.*" So we, Jesus' followers, will avoid condemnation and have Eternal Life. How many times have we heard some of our separated brethren saying: "Are you saved? I am," or, some other Christian sect members telling us that **they** and not **we** are predestined to be saved ... what a foolish thing to say! Jesus died for **all!**

But let us remember St. Augustine's remark: "*The one who redeemed you without you, will not save you without you.*" We must accept God's hand which is **always** extended to us; we must enter into the circle of God's light and abandon wicked deeds and evil; otherwise we, even though redeemed by the blood of the Lamb, will perish forever. Our good actions show the strength of our faith, and on Judgment Day we will hear Jesus' words (Mt 25:40) "*Whatever you did for one of these least brothers, you did it to me.*" James reaffirmed the need of our positive response to God's grace or gift of faith: "*Faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.*" (Jas 2:17).

**Are you keeping your Lenten resolution to increase your prayer time and to do penance?** Are you getting ready to celebrate the Holy Week and to renew your commitment to Jesus, when, at Easter, we will have the renewal of our Baptismal Promises? Let us not get discouraged when we fail to keep our Lenten promises made to Jesus: after all, we are sinners! Let us start anew to renew our commitment to Jesus, or offer another sacrifice. The past is past, what we have is the present; let us live it fully with Jesus, in joyful penance for all our sins.

**This weekend we are having The Catholic Relief Services collection.** When you donate to The Catholic Relief Services Collection, you are not giving just your money. You are giving hope. Through humanitarian aid, resettling displaced individuals and families, and providing legal and advocacy services for migrants, the Catholic Relief Services Collection allows us to see every encounter with a person who is suffering as an opportunity to help Jesus in disguise. As always, thank you for your generosity. Our God will reward you.

**The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is currently dispensed (Bishop Frank J. Dewane will indicate a new date).**



**Wednesday, March 17, we celebrate the memorial of St. Patrick**, bishop of Ireland. There is a special dispensation from our Lenten sacrifices on that day. We hope all you Irish enjoy your celebrations (and we know everyone is Irish on St. Patrick's Day!), but please if you drink, have a designated driver. Happy St. Patrick's Day to all!

**And naturally, let's not forget the Feast of St. Joseph on Friday, March 19.** Happy St. Joseph's Day to all our Italian American friends and family! Joseph: honored on March 19 since the end of the 10th c; declared Patron of the Universal Church in 1870 by Pope Pius IX, and Guardian of the Redeemer in 1989 by Pope John Paul II; patron of workers and carpenters and fathers; also of Austria, Belgium, Bohemia, Canada, Mexico, Peru and (south) Vietnam; mentioned in Eucharistic Prayers I-IV. It is custom in some places today to bless bread, pastries, and other food and to give a large portion of it to the poor.

**Today, the second scrutiny of the catechumens** will take place after the liturgy of the word. These rites are intended to purify the hearts and minds of the elect, to strengthen them against temptation, to help them progress in the love of God.




