

From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...

My Dear Friends,

Vaccines are being distributed, but it seems to some people to be too slow, but consider that on February 24, only four deaths were reported (on January 26 deaths were 183): vaccines work!

The Gospel for the Third Sunday of Lent introduces us to a disturbing image of Jesus using violence! Also unsettling is the fact that animals were sold in the temple of God. Please remember that we are talking about worship in ancient times, when to destroy an animal on a fiery altar was a humble act of worship to God, and a petition for favors from the Almighty, or, for the Pagans from their gods. Pilgrims used to go to the great temple of Jerusalem from all over the world, and the sale of animals in the temple was done so that pilgrims did not need to travel from afar carrying the animals to be sacrificed. The money accepted in the temple was the Tyrian half-shekel; all other currencies were seldom accepted, so this fact made necessary the help of money changers.

It was a mess, I am sure, and far from the reverence owed to the house of God, that which Jesus calls “*My Father’s House*”, another sign of Jesus’ divinity! Anyway, it must have been a scene to be remembered for years to come (well about 2000 years!).

There is a hard lesson to be learned here: that at times we must defend God’s rights with firmness, without worrying too much about being politically correct! It is the silence of the lambs that makes the screams of the wolves so scary! We Christians are gentle, meek human beings, but not a bunch of cowardly fools. We do go the extra mile, or give generously to the poor for the sake of the kingdom; but we can, and we must, stand up to injustice and oppression. We must make everyone on earth a citizen of God’s earth, enjoying the freedom of God’s children. We are followers of Jesus, our only shepherd, but we are not sheepish and cowed-down disciples! With the sacrament of confirmation, we have received the strength to be soldiers of Christ, the King of the Universe! Let us then be loyal, courageous and fearless! This topic makes me think about the war against terrorists which, as I write this bulletin, still goes on. If you desire peace, the old Roman pagans used to say, prepare for war. But we, Jesus’ followers, are peace-loving people; we need the miracle of peace today. Let us offer our Holy Communion today so that this miracle of true peace will be granted to us by God.

Our Holy Father Pope Francis has also warned us on the need for us to fight for the truth which God, as Jesus said, “*I’m the way, the Truth and the Life*,” especially warning us about fake news:

What Is “Fake” About Fake News (Pope Francis)

The term fake news has been the object of great discussion and debate. In general, it refers to the spreading of disinformation online or in the traditional media. It has to do with false information based on nonexistent or distorted data meant to deceive and manipulate the reader. Spreading fake news can serve to advance specific goals, influence political decisions and serve economic interests.

The effectiveness of fake news is primarily due to its ability to mimic real news, to seem plausible. Second, this false but believable news is captious, inasmuch as it grasps people’s attention by appealing to stereotypes and common social prejudices, and exploiting instantaneous emotions like anxiety,

contempt, anger and frustration. The ability to spread such fake news often relies on manipulative use of the social networks and the way they function. Untrue stories can spread so quickly that even authoritative denials fail to contain the damage.

The difficulty of unmasking and eliminating fake news is due also to the fact that many people interact in homogeneous digital environments impervious to differing perspectives and opinions. Disinformation thus thrives on the absence of healthy confrontation with other sources of information that could effectively challenge prejudices and generate constructive dialogue; instead, it risks turning people into unwilling accomplices in spreading biased and baseless ideas.

The tragedy of disinformation is that it discredits others, presenting them as enemies to the point of demonizing them and fomenting conflict. Fake news is a sign of intolerant and hypersensitive attitudes, and leads only to the spread of arrogance and hatred. That is the end result of untruth.

Pope Francis, (2/15/18), Communications Day Message, Origins

The Gospel also brings us another point: the respect of God’s temple, the church. Respect, devotion, adoration, singing and praying together, dress code, solicitude to find a seat for everybody, thanksgiving after Holy Communion. Jesus is requiring all these attitudes from us! Let us listen to Him: “*My house is a house of prayer!*”

Dress properly and modestly, greet each other and the ushers and Priests when you come in and leave the church, then sit in prayer and silent veneration after due genuflection to Jesus, really and physically present in the Tabernacle. In taking your seat, make sure to keep safe distance.

On entering the Church, remember that signing yourself with a contrite heart and with the Holy water will cancel all your venial sins. When we visit the open houses in Sarasota, we are very respectful of the place we visit; how much more we should be in the House of God!

I’m encouraged by the number of parishioners attending daily Holy Masses even in these pandemic times. Lent is not only the time to give up our bad habits and the little pleasures of life, but it is the time to give in to God! Let us pray more at home and on the road, especially by receiving Jesus in our hearts! Remember that Saint Pope John Paul II has given permission to all Catholics to receive Jesus in Holy Communion twice a day, when you participate twice in the Holy Sacrifice. Let us offer our second daily Holy Mass for all the people who offend God by not going to church, so that our Communion will bring them back home to the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary.

I want to express my gratitude to those who have responded so far to our 2021 Offertory Campaign and Catholic Faith Appeal. Your generous offerings will make a real difference in providing financial stability to our beautiful parish and support of the wonderful diocesan ministries. If you have not returned your commitment cards, we ask that you complete them and mail to the parish office or drop them in the offertory basket at Mass. If you need a commitment card, please contact the parish office.




has been changed recently. Following many of your complaints regarding privacy and secrecy of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and having the everyday experience of confessions through the open window, where many church attendees pass behind the window at a very short distance, not guaranteeing the individuality and protection of your words, we have decided to return to the confessions to inside the Reconciliation Room.

All safety measures required by the Diocese will be kept. We ask you to line up outside, as you do now. Each person is invited individually inside. The priests will keep 6ft distance. The rooms are sanitized daily by our maintenance team. Cleaning wipes will be provided next to the chair, and we ask you to disinfect your chair and sanitize the door handle after your confession to make it ready for the next person.

Sacrament of Reconciliation is a very personal and intimate encounter with our Lord Jesus Christ. We want you to feel comfortable before opening your heart and soul to God, and that is the main reason for the amendments. We hope you will find yourself comfortable and safe at St. Martha's Reconciliation Room and make it your dearest place to meet Jesus.




