

From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto...

My Dear Friends,

I'm writing this message ten days to this Sunday bulletin. In Sarasota, we had 32,599 cases with 812 deaths. In Florida 2.25 million cases with 35,398 deaths (no deaths recently in Sarasota), with 9,184,860 vaccinations. The situation is getting more hopeful for a faster return to normalcy.

Today is the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ into Heaven. Many Christians believe that Jesus walked, ate, slept, preached and performed miracles for 40 days after his Glorious Resurrection. But an objective reading of the Gospel shows that Jesus kept **appearing** - **NOT** staying continuously - with His apostles and disciples, according to His plan to reinforce the faith of the followers. One time He appeared to more than 500 brethren assembled together, as St. Paul tells us in 1 Cor 15:6. The last time He appeared to His followers, Jesus used the powerful image of levitation - suspension and movement of our bodies in mid-air, naturally without artificial means of support whatsoever - because of the Jewish popular belief, that we colloquially also follow today, that God's house is in the Heavens!

The Ascension commemorates the last **public** appearance of Jesus on earth before His second coming. Naturally, Jesus' private appearances did take place later on. In biblical times, the most famous one is when Jesus manifested His personal identity with the persecuted Christians to the persecutor Saul on His journey to Damascus (Acts 9:4; Gal 1:13; Hil 3:6).

The Ascension also gives us the consoling pre-figuration of our own resurrection, when our bodies ("Pneumatica Somata" in St. Paul's words) will be reunited with our souls to start the never-ending paradisiacal eternity!

In describing our risen body, comparing to what the gospels tell us about Jesus' risen body, the ancient theologians used four typical characteristics:

1. Immortality: impossibility of death, and of all causes of mortality: pain, suffering, illnesses.
2. Spiritual Body (as St. Paul said): the quality of spiritual properties applied to a body (passing through walls...etc.)
3. Agility: moving at the speed of the mind.
4. Claritas Visionis: all risen bodies resplendent in beauty beyond belief.

Next week is Pentecost Sunday, the Birthday of the Church, and the vestments of the Holy Mass are **RED**, just like the flames of fire, levitating over the heads of Jesus' followers on that fateful Pentecost Day, and they are a visible sign of the coming of the Holy Spirit upon Mary, Peter, and Jesus' followers. Let's all wear some **RED** clothing to celebrate the birthday of our faith.

How mysterious is the presence of God among us! How consoling are Jesus' words: "*Yet the word you hear is not mine, but that of the Father who sent me...the advocate, the Holy Spirit that the Father will send in My name, He will teach you...*" Who are we that the Almighty cares and loves and forgives so much? How many times instead we ponder God's existence and we become so befuddled and overwhelmed by His incredible love. We, strangely enough, doubt His existence; but we have such doubt because of our human mind's inability to grasp God. Naturally, only God can truly know and grasp the existential depth of God! We can only grasp what is human! We do know about God because Jesus told us, but to know a truth does not mean we are able to understand, or grasp the depth of such divine truth.

A 5-year-old boy can memorize the Einstein Theory of Relativity, and he can express it in correct words, but he cannot grasp all its meaning! We confidently and rightly

affirm the Love of God, but can any of us understand this mystery? So doubts, despair, anger, crazy joy and trust...all these are the companions in our faith journey to paradise. But we'll reach heaven, no matter what, because God is crazily in love with us.

A parishioner sent me an e-mail: "Not having gone to a parochial school, I kept wondering if, except for breaking the Commandments, are there other mortal sins...?" The term "mortal sin" is taken from the Bible. We read in 1 John 5:16-17, "*There is such a thing as mortal sin... All wrongdoing is sin, but there is a sin that is not mortal.*" And because John had remarked previously: "*If the sin is not mortal ...*" (1 John 5:16), the Catholic Church divides sin into two categories: mortal and venial. The mortal or deadly sin, as its name implies, causes the death of the relationship between God and a Christian, whereas the venial (from the Latin "Veniale Peccatum" = forgivable sin) is a minor offense to God and is "**forgivable**," which means, "**without need to go to confession.**" To teach people how to catch the distinction between the two types of sin, the theologians say that a mortal sin (which, if not confessed, will cause us to be condemned to eternal death!) needs the following three conditions to be fulfilled:

1. Full knowledge and consciousness of what we are doing.
2. Full assent of our will to such thought or action.
3. Serious transgression of the will of God.

Having been a priest for 60 years (really!), I suspect that the most common mortal sins are:

- Missing Mass on Sundays and Holy Days without serious cause.
- Not forgiving or hating one's stinky neighbors, so that we do not pray for them, and gossip and slander them at any occasion. By the way, many confuse not forgiving with not forgetting. We will always remember the harm done to us, (unless we suffer from Alzheimer's!), but we go beyond such remembrance with a prayer of forgiveness more meritorious in the eyes of God.
- Omitting the serious duty to help the poor, the needy, the discriminated against and the social outcast.

I hope these few words will help you all!




