

From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto...

My Dear Friends,

The CDC has taken another step toward normalcy, which is reflected in our Bishop's letter of Friday, May 14, addressed to all Catholics of the Diocese of Venice of Florida. I quote the two main paragraphs:

"With this letter, I wish to address the face covering and distancing policy at Mass and Parish gatherings in the Diocese of Venice. As you are aware, on May 13, 2021, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention provided updated guidance for vaccinated individuals with regards to face masks and distancing. Under the new guidance, those who are fully vaccinated are no longer required to wear masks or physically distance except where required by law.

In accordance with the new CDC guidance and effective immediately, masks and distancing will no longer be required at Mass in the Diocese of Venice. Masks remain encouraged and certainly permitted, particularly for those who are not yet vaccinated. Masks will no longer be required for Parish group activities or other Parish gatherings."

Please remember that this optional use of the mask, and elimination of the safe distance doesn't apply yet to schools. Other past provisions remain in effect. Please remember that the pandemic is still strong and can mutate into some new insidious form. Also on May 14, here, in our magnificent state, we had 3,590 new cases with 71 deaths. **Vaccination** is the key for return to normalcy; at that same date, our state of 21 million, there were 9,809,136 Floridians who have received at least one dose (45.7%)

Happy Birthday to All! Today, Pentecost Sunday, is the birthday of the Catholic Church founded by Christ, and **we are the Church!** On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Blessed Trinity, descended over the apostles, the pious women and a great number of disciples gathered in prayer around Mary, Jesus' mother. Since then, this Spirit of the Love of God, for the last 2,000 years (and until the second coming of Jesus), has guided our Catholic Church, helping us Catholics to be faithful to Jesus' universal teachings, committed to love one another, even if we have broken each other's hearts. Ready to accept, serve and live in harmony with persons who are not pleasant: the unlovable, the poor, society's rejects, the hungry, victims of AIDS and the oppressed.

The Holy Spirit, present in us since our Baptism, and in a very special way in our Confirmation, leads us to love Jesus more and more, so to become one with Him every Sunday in Holy Communion, until we will be one with God in Paradise. This Holy Spirit gives us many gifts, among them is that confidence and unshakable trust in God that will help us get over fear and anxieties. "There is no fear in love, but perfect love drives out fear because fear has to do with punishment, and so one who fears is not yet perfect in love" (1Jn 4:18). Let us always pray: *"Come Holy Spirit, and enkindle in us the fire of your love!"* **HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO ALL!**

With Pentecost, our Catholic calendar ends the Easter season (white vestments) and enters the so-called Ordinary Time when the priests wear green vestments. The Easter Candle is put back in its place away from the pulpit where it has stood since that glorious Easter night, when we greeted the risen Lord. In the Baptismal Rite, the candles of the newly baptized are lit from the Easter candle, as a sign of our future birth in paradise. By the way, did you know that the ancient Christians never used to say, "Today is the anniversary of the death of this Saint," they instead always said, "Today we celebrate

the birthday of this Saint," referring to the beginning, or birth, of our eternal life.

Our beloved Pope Francis, in his filial love for Jesus' mother, has instituted the new feast of Mary, Mother of the Church, as our beloved Bishop has just written in his letter and I quote:

"Pope Francis has established a new feast of Our Lady for the General Roman Calendar. The new celebration, which holds the rank of obligatory Memorial, will take place on the Monday following Pentecost and honors the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. In 2018, the new obligatory Memorial will fall on May 21...."

For the celebration of Mass on this day, Parishes should use the Votive Mass of Our Lady, Mother of the Church. This may be found at number 10.B in the Votive Masses in the Roman Missal. As was noted above, the readings are proper and may be found herein as Enclosures 3 and 4.

In the Liturgy of the Hours, only the closing prayer is proper for this Memorial. Please see Enclosure 2 for the text of this prayer. The Psalms should be taken from the Psalter of the Day, while the other elements may be taken from either the Psalter of the Day or the Common of the Blessed Virgin Mary."

Let us honor our Beloved Mother in this month dedicated to her.

On another topic, many times non-Catholics ask, "Why do Catholics have to go to confession?" The answer is given in today's Gospel, when Jesus gave the Apostles the most awesome power of forgiving sins, and reconciling us with God: *"If you forgive people's sins, they are forgiven; if you hold them bound, they are held bound"* (Jn 20:23). It is mind boggling to me why Jesus gave sinners the power to forgive the sins of other sinners. Maybe God thought that being sinners ourselves, we priests will be much more merciful and forgiving of others...I hope we priests always will be good mirrors of God's compassionate love.

Six Bishops from Connecticut issued formal statements reinforcing teaching of the presence of Jesus Christ in Holy Communion. Among items noted were:

1. Only those who accept and believe what the Catholic Church teaches about the Eucharist can receive in a Catholic Church.
2. All are required to fast from food and drink, except water, for at least an hour before receiving Communion.
3. Un-baptized persons, including those in R.C.I.A classes, should not receive Communion.
4. No one who prefers receiving Communion on the tongue should be obliged to receive it in the hand.

By the way, when entering or leaving church, Latin-rite Catholics, usually genuflect (if arthritis doesn't kill your poor joints) and Eastern-rite Christians bow instead. The sign of the cross with holy water accompanies this genuflection. All venial sins are forgiven in this case.

The symbol of the Holy Spirit is the Dove; when you enter the Basilica of St. Peter in Rome, beyond the Altar you will notice a stained glass window with the dove amidst golden rays of glory. A few years ago, two generous parishioners, Tony and Eileen Massaro, donated a wood-carving reproduction of St. Peter's window, work of the Roman artist Luciano Ghezzi, so that the Dove of the Holy Spirit can shine the rays of divine love on all of us, St. Martha's faithful.

Our Bishop Nevins Academy, home to St. Martha School and St. Mary Academy, will close the school year 2020-2021 on Friday, May 28. We thank God for having



protected our beautiful children from any disaster during this full pandemic year. Parents, teachers, staff and children enjoy your summer recess! Here are a few words from our St. Martha School principal, Siobhan Young:

The 2020-2021 school year was a year like no other; that's for sure. Coming back to school in August we were met with different feelings than any school year ever before. We were all nervous to go back to our school and things were very different. Many of our friends were on the screen instead of in seats next to us. It was strange for everyone.

However, through it all we remained strong, committed to our faith and we learned anyway. We made new friends, we had new experiences and we found our way. Even though we did not leave the school for field trips or go to Mass every week in the beautiful chapel we learned new skills and prayed anyway. In conjunction with the Catholic Community Foundation, parishioners can name St. Martha as the beneficiary of a Charitable Gift Annuity. A Charitable Gift Annuity is a great way to support St. Martha, while at the same time, generating a guaranteed life-long income for you, the donor.

A Charitable Gift Annuity is a contract between the donor and the Catholic Community Foundation, whereby the donor receives a partial tax deduction with fixed payments for the rest of their life in exchange for a gift of cash or securities. The money remaining in the account at the end of their life is given to St. Martha.

The annuity contract uses rates based on age, life expectancy and assumed investment returns, which are intended to produce a final gift to St. Martha of 50% of the original funding amount.


