

From our Pastor, Fr. George...

**Dear parishioners of St. Martha,
Sunday Sermon – Pentecost Sunday**

At this time, some particular groups of people are in more need of the healing of the Holy Spirit than others. Among them I would place the people of Ukraine, the people concerned with the up-coming High Court decision regarding abortion, the hurting and suffering families in Texas and Buffalo. They have very strong reasons to pray for the gift of the Holy Spirit after they have lost their loved ones. They are recent victims of the culture of death, multiple numbers of war losses, results of abortion; nineteen plus two in Texas, nine in the Buffalo supermarket. They were human beings, gifts of God, loved by mothers, fathers, children, sisters, brothers, grandparents, relatives, friends. They were valuable citizens, people with potential gifts to others, destroyed by evil, which spreads the culture of death.

Awhile ago in 1995, Pope St. John Paul II said in his encyclical, The Gospel of Life: ***“Nothing and no one can in any way permit the killing of an innocent human being, whether a fetus or an embryo, an infant or an adult, an old person, or one suffering from an incurable disease, or a person who is dying. Furthermore, no one is permitted to ask for this act of killing, either for himself or herself or for another person entrusted to his or her care, nor can he or she consent to it, either explicitly or implicitly. Nor can any authority legitimately recommend or permit such an action.”*** (Par. 57)

We, the children of God, should be creative in bringing life to the world, in preventing destructive wars, in saving innocent lives, in protecting children and vulnerable people. We need to build the culture of life. God, the Father in heaven, the Creator of Life builds the culture of life. He sent Jesus to restore the original state of grace and he sent the Holy Spirit, the Giver of Life to help us to bring life to the world.

We pray today, that the Holy Spirit will renew the face of the earth, will help us to defeat the culture of death, will overcome regimes which oppress free people, will inspire people to respect life from conception to natural death.

In the Creed we profess our faith in the Holy Spirit, ***the Lord, the Giver of Life***. This life-giving role of the Holy Spirit is first manifested for us in the Sacrament of Baptism. Let’s remember it today!

In Baptism, in the name of Jesus, ***we are baptized in water and the Holy Spirit***.

Then in the sacrament of Confirmation, we receive the anointing with the Oil of Chrism and hear the prayer which uses our Confirmation name and says: ***“Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.”*** With this our Christian Initiation is complete. We are sealed for good with the Holy Spirit.

When our physical life is shaken or our spiritual life shattered, we receive the Holy Spirit for physical and spiritual healing.

When we come to confessions to renew our spiritual life and we hear the words of the sacramental absolution of sins, at one point a priest says: ***“God send the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins.”***

In the sacrament of the sick we hear the words: ***“May the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit.”***

Prayer for the gifts of the Holy Spirit

O LORD JESUS CHRIST, Who before ascending into Heaven promised to send the Holy Spirit to finish your work in the souls of your Apostles and Disciples, deign to grant the same Holy Spirit to me, that He may perfect in my soul the work of your grace and your love.

Grant me the Spirit of **Wisdom**, that I may despise the perishable things of this world and aspire only after the things that are eternal;

the Spirit of **Understanding**, to enlighten my mind with the light of Thy Divine truth;

the Spirit of **Counsel**, that I may ever choose the surest way of pleasing God and gaining Heaven;

the Spirit of **Courage**, that I may bear my cross with Thee and that I may overcome with courage all the obstacles that oppose my salvation;

the Spirit of **Knowledge**, that I may know God and know myself and grow perfect in the science of the Saints;

the Spirit of **Reverence**, that I may find the service of God sweet and amiable;

the Spirit of **Wonder and Awe**, that I may be filled with a loving reverence towards God and may dread in any way to displease Him.

Mark me, Dear Lord, with the sign of your true disciples, and animate me in all things with your Spirit. Amen.

Turn to me and have mercy on me; show your strength on behalf of your servant; save me, because I serve you just as my mother did.


Give me a sign of your goodness, that my enemies may see it and be put to shame, for you, Lord, have helped me and comforted me. (Psalm 86)






