From our Pastor, Fr. George...

Dear Parishioners of St. Martha,

Sunday Sermon – Palm Sunday

From Dn. Vern

"My God, My God, why have you abandoned me?"

All of us, from time to time, tend to think that God may have abandoned us - we think that we are left to our own resources, unable to cope, alone and vulnerable. Apparently, Jesus knew that feeling.

Matthew's passion narrative, which was just proclaimed in today's Palm Sunday liturgy, repeats the poignant expression, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" And we are left with the puzzle of trying to figure out how the Son of God, Our Lord Jesus Christ---true God, Man---could possibly have experienced psychological abandonment that produced that outcry. We can only ponder the mystery, but the very pondering of those words can give us strength.

In today's first reading, taken from the prophet Isaiah, puts the following words on the lips of the Suffering Servant of Yahweh: "The Lord God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame" (Isa 50:7). Deep down in His heart of hearts, Jesus knew this; he knew that he would not be abandoned, but in some mysterious way an awareness of that fact escaped his consciousness at that dreadful moment on the cross. His face was set like flint, suggesting the presence of unshakable faith, but the consciousness of God's presence was mysteriously absent.

Elsewhere in the Old Testament, in the Book of Genesis, the story is related of how Abraham was instructed to sacrifice his son Isaac and, although deeply troubled and confused, remained obedient to the Lord's command. He proved himself to be up to the test. As you will recall from the Genesis account, "Abraham took the wood for the holocaust and laid it on his sons Isaac's shoulders, while he himself carried the fire and the knife. As the two walked on together, Isaac spoke to his father Abraham, 'Father!' he said. 'Yes son,' he replied. Isaac continued, 'Here are the fire and the wood, but where is the sheep for the holocaust?' 'Son,' Abraham answered, 'God himself will provide the sheep for the holocaust.' Then the two continued going forward" (22:6-8)

They continued going forward.

God hovered over them every step of the way unseen by them; they were unaware. They "continued going forward" and not only the eye of God but the love of God hovered over them every step of the way. Eventually, the voice of the Lord's messenger called to Abraham...do not lay your hand on the boy...Do not the least thing to him." "Again, the Lord's messenger called to Abraham from heaven and said: 'I swear by myself, says the Lord that because you acted as you did in not withholding from me your beloved son, I will bless you abundantly" (Gen 22:12)

And something similar happened with Jesus on his way of the cross, which was retraced for you in the reading of the passion narrative in this Palm Sunday liturgy. The love of God hovered over him every step of the way. Momentary expressions of that love broke through, for example, in the intervention of Simon of Cyrene whose shoulder eased for a few moments the burden of the cross weighing heavily on the shoulders of Jesus. But once nailed to the cross, he

was alone, left to die. Abandoned. Or so he seemed to think when he cried out "My God, my God, why have abandoned me?"

Perhaps you know the feeling. Perhaps those words have been, at one time or another, your own. Well, as you walk the way of the cross in companionship and loving memory with Jesus today, be grateful to the courageous Christ who set his face like flint and walked on in a faith that did not fail him, toward a fate that can make sense only when viewed in the framework of the divine foolishness. Ask for the grace to see that any segment of the way of the cross that you are asked to walk during your short time here on earth is the sure and certain way to eternal glory.

You are called to live and die under the banner of the cross. The full liturgical observance of this holy week that begins today will help you see the divine foolishness outlined for you today in the reading of the passion narrative according to St. Matthew.

Holy Week – remembering the holiest days in the life of Jesus. Since Christ accomplished his work of human redemption and of the perfect glorification of God principally through his Passion Mystery, in which by dying he has destroyed our death and by rising restored our life, the sacred Paschal Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord shines forth as the high point of the entire liturgical year.

Palm Sunday – solemn entry into Jerusalem, where Jesus was welcomed like a king by people throwing palm branches under his feet and shouted: "Hosana to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Oh, King of Israel! Hosana in the Highest."

Chrism Mass – properly concelebrated by the bishop with his clergy. It is a sign of the unity and communion of the priests with their bishop. The blessing of the Oil of the Sick takes place before the end of the Eucharistic Prayer, but the blessing of the Oil of Catechumens and the consecration of the Chrism take place after Communion. This year: in the Cathedral on Tue. April 4th at 10.30am.

Holy Thursday – The Mystery of the Last Supper of the Lord with his disciples at which Jesus instituted the Eucharist and Priesthood and, by washing his disciples' feet, showed that he came to serve and taught his followers to do the same.

This year especially we invite you and encourage to adore the Blessed Sacrament, exposed on the Altar of Repose at the end of our Mass of the Lord's Supper until 10.00pm.

Good Friday – We don't celebrate Mass on this day of the Passion of Our Lord, or any other sacraments. This is the day of the Passion and death of Christ on the cross. The Church adores the Lord, venerates the cross, fasts, prays and shows love to the needy.

Easter Vigil – Special Easter Liturgy of fire (Blessing of new fire), Lighting and blessing of the Paschal Candle, Solemn procession with the Paschal Candle – "Lumen Christi" (The Light of Christ), Deacon will sing the Exultet (The Hymn of praise to the Paschal Candle, the symbol of the resurrection of Christ). Biblical readings will remind us of the fundamental truths of the history of salvation. Then we will bless the water, baptize the Catechumens and confirm the candidates. During the Mass our Catechumens and Candidates will receive the First Holy Communion and will be accepted as the members of the Catholic Community.

Easter Sunday – On this Solemnity of the Resurrection of Christ there will be a Renewal of Baptismal vows and sprinkling the congregation with water.

We pray to the Lord for the end of war in Ukraine: Jesus, the Prince of peace, come to our help!

You, Lord, are forgiving and good, abounding in love to all who call to you.

Hear my prayer, Lord; listen to my cry for mercy. When I am in distress, I call to you, because you answer me.

Arrogant foes are attacking me, O God; ruthless people are trying to kill me - they have no regard for you. But you, Lord, are a compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness.

Turn to me and have mercy on me; show your strength on behalf of your servant; save me, because I serve you just as my mother did.

Give me a sign of your goodness, that my enemies may see it and be put to shame, for you, Lord, have helped me and comforted me. (Psalm 86)

Jesus, the Prince of peace, come to our help!


