*From our Pastor, Fr. George...***Dear Parishioners of St. Martha,****Sunday Sermon** – 5th Sunday of Easter*From Dc. Vern*

Phillip does you a great favor by making the request you hear in today's Gospel from John: "*Master, show us the Father.*"

I say Phillip is doing you a favor by making this request, because he sets the stage for a wonderful lesson from your Master Teacher. In response to the question, Jesus tells us all that anyone who sees him—observes him preaching, teaching, healing, helping – is seeing God the Father at work. Well, you may be asking what's so special about that? Let me try to explain.

You believe in the triune God — Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The mystery of Trinity is beyond your grasp. You accept it only on faith; you understand it incompletely at best. In other words, you could use some help in grasping the mystery of the Trinity, in coming up with a satisfactory answer to the question: What is God like?

Moreover, you worship an unseen God. You call God "Father," and so you should, but you cannot see your heavenly Father. You can see him in the effects of what he has done for you as a Creator. The beauty of nature reflects the beauty of the Creator. You can see in him the goodness of those around you. The goodness of those you meet in your journey through life reflects the goodness of God your Father. You see the effects of his divine power in the powerful forces of nature. But you can see his love—and remember, God is love—you can see his love only in love made plain for you in human form. And no one does that for you better than Jesus Christ, the Son, the divine person who is, along with the Father and the Holy Spirit, your one God.

"*Master show us the Father.*" And Jesus asks, with just a hint of exasperation, "*Have I been with you for so long a time, and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you not believe that I am in the father and the Father is in me?*"

Pick up on that suggestion, follow that direction. Look at the Jesus you meet in the pages of the gospel and see—when you are looking at Jesus – a reflection, not just a reminder, but a reflection of the all-powerful Father – your Father who is in heaven.

For example, let me take you to the road that leads out of a city called Nain. You have been there before. You found it in the seventh chapter of Luke's Gospel where you fell into step with Jesus and his disciples and a rather large crowd walking along when they came upon a small funeral procession at the city gate. The only son of a widowed mother was being carried out to burial. Luke's account tells you, "*When the Lord saw her [the widowed mother] he was moved with pity for her and said to her, 'Do not weep.' He stepped forward and touched the coffin; at this the bearers halted, and he said. 'Young man, I tell you arise.' The dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother*" (Luke 7:13-15).

Now, remember, "*whoever sees me, sees the Father.*" You see Jesus stretch out his hand to touch the coffin that carried the dead man's body. As you look at the outstretched hand, recall the many biblical references to God's strong right arm, to the hand of God that will uphold

the just and defend them from their enemies; recall the references to the hand of God in the psalms and the prophets, and then see here – as you watch Jesus – see the Father at work. See the divine pity as the divine power. See the Father, the heavenly Father, the all-powerful Father, moved with compassion for a poor widow. In the loving touch of Jesus see the loving touch of your Father.

Just watch Jesus, if you need help grasping an understanding of what God your Father is like.

Other examples abound in the four Gospels. Observe Jesus talking to the Samaritan woman at the well. Listen to his conversation with the woman taken in adultery. Watch him inviting Zacchaeus to climb down from the sycamore tree and then you can follow the two of them into the home of Zacchaeus. What a house blessing that was! See Jesus feeding the five thousand. In all these compelling scenes you are seeing the Father. Why? Because "*Whoever has seen me has seen the Father.*" And put yourself in the place of those to whom Jesus is talking and ministering in these various events. Just a little imagination will enable you to let Jesus (and the Father) deal directly with you. Go ahead and let it happen.

It is important that you apply all this to yourself. The father is within reach – his reach of you; your reach of him. He is there – with you, around you, indeed within you. And he relates to you with compassion and pity just as Jesus reached out to encourage, heal, and befriend those he met along the way: "*Whoever sees, me sees the Father.*"

Let these thoughts sink into you very soul. They are insulation against loneliness, fear, and discouragement. All your life long, you've been hearing priest and fellow believers say, "*May the Lord be with you.*" Well, it's time to convince yourself of the fact that the Lord is indeed with you – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And this is the same Lord who says to you, as he said to his disciples centuries ago, "*I am the way, the truth, and the life.*" Ask for the grace today, to be able to take him at his word! If you do, you will surely know where you are going; and you will, by God's grace, be a person of peace and purpose.
