## From Our Pastor, Father George

### Dear Parishioners of St. Martha,

**Sunday Sermon** — 12th Sunday of the Year

From Deacon Vern Smith:

The opening words of today's Gospel passage have Jesus saying to the Twelve, and derivatively down through the centuries to you: Fear no one. How do you react to that directive? Fear no one, he says, and then goes on to assert: Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known.

If any of you are like me, you may be saying that you don't find those words all that reassuring; they in fact give you some cause for fear. But he repeats his instructions: Fear no one. Do not be afraid, this Gospel tells you, of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather be afraid of the one who can destroy the soul and body in Gehenna.

Jesus is putting some serious considerations before you today. He also offers you hope and encouragement with the remainder that you are worth more than many sparrows, the sparrow does not fall to the ground without your Father's knowledge, and, presumably, without your Father's caring providence, the providence that he has in infinitely greater measure for you.

Let's face up to fear for a few moments today. At least let's think, in the light of today's Gospel, about our experience of fear in everyday life.

Fear is part of the coin you need to pay your dues for membership in the human race. No one can go through life without the experience of fear.

Fear makes the positive contribution of defending (or at least warning) you against danger. In the ordinary, everyday, common sense meaning of the word, fear can weigh you down, knock you out, hold you back, destroy your peace of mind, force you to withdraw, and rob your heart of happiness. The Christian tradition reminds those who are faithful but also fearful, that love can drive out fear. In the First Letter of John (4:18-19) you will read: There is no fear in love, but perfect love drives out fear because fear has to do with punishment, and so one who fears is not yet perfect in love. We love because he first loved us. Keep that in mind as you think about fear in your life.

A not-so-ordinary and far less obvious understanding of the word would equate fear with reverence. Fear of the Lord, a familiar expression in several religious traditions, should be understood in this way. Your reverence before the Lord is an expression of fear of the Lord. This is not servile fear, and most assuredly not neurotic fear. It is reverence in the face of an awe-inspiring reality, namely, the presence of an all-knowing, all-powerful, all-loving God in your life.

What a distortion of this special meaning of fear when someone threatens to put the fear of God in you! God is never to be feared in a display of fright-filled cowering on your part. You show your fear of God in reverence. Fear your own capacity to reject your God but have no fear that God will ever reject you.

Fearless is a quality often attributed to persons who do heroic things. Sometimes those who seem to be fearless are insufficiently aware of (perhaps too dumb to comprehend) the real danger in a given situation. But when all the hazards are noted and fully understood, the one who is "fearless," is one who has overcome fear, not one who is without fear.

Most of us have to learn how to manage our fears as we move forward, rather than permitting fear to hold us back. A rabbit's foot is no guarantee of safe passage. Putting your own foot forward, despite the fears that seem to be closing in on you, is the only way to go.

Of what are you afraid? What fears weigh you down? Make mental notes or jot them down on paper. You'll probably find yourself sorting them out in general categories like health, money, and work, or in more personal folders that catalogue your phobias. That will be like looking at yourself in a house of mirrors. Be fair enough to yourself to acknowledge that the images those mirrors throw-back are distorted (exaggerated fears?). You can work out the distortions with professional help, if you need it, or by just laughing at yourself (as everyone does in a house of mirrors) and moving on.

It's been said that anyone that harbors habitual fear is "landlord to a ghost." The point is worth considering. Some of your fears point to the past, but the past is dead (it's a ghost). Some point to the future, but the future may never arrive, at least not in the form that you now anticipate (that ghost may never show up). Why permit an invisible enemy like fear to pull you out of the present moment, the only moment that is fully in your possession?

Most of that which you fear does not exist, at least does not exist in the present moment, the only place where you live. You have to remember that a life lived in fear is a life half-lived, so handing yourself over to present fears means giving up a valuable portion of your life. Handing yourself over to fears of the past puts you in the custody of a ghost. And turning yourself over to fears about the future "gives up the ghost," as they say, leaving you helpless and, go ahead and say it—afraid. It makes no sense.

You can make a lot of sense by taking charge of your life, which is another way of saying, taking charge of your fears. If you have trouble doing that, get professional help. If you can do it with difficulty, get to work right now because it will not be easier at any time in the future.

Take a minute now or prior to receiving Jesus, to pray your fears down to manageable size. And to help you in prayer here is a good prayer to start with:

Fear of failure. Fear of the dark. Fear of illness. Fear of rejection. Fear of discovery. Fear of speaking up, or out, or saying it in public. Fear of losing my job. Fear of harm to those I love. Fear of hating those who do me harm. Fear of heights, or depths, of water, and of fire. Fear of falling. Fear of abandonment, engulfment, annihilation. Fear of those who want (I think) to do me harm.

Why should I be afraid of all these, Lord, and of so much more? It can be because I think I'm altogether on my own, placing myself away from you,

out of touch, and out of reach. The power is yours, Lord; certain tasks are mine. I'll do what I can; I'll muddle through somehow, because I believe that you are here with me, and I have nothing to fear. Nothing. Amen.

Both Saints are the principal patrons of Rome.


