From Our Pastor, Father George

Dear Parishioners of St. Martha,

Sunday Sermon — 19th Sunday Ordinary Time Year

From Deacon Vern Smith:

Jesus asks a question in the Gospel reading from this week's liturgy, that each one of us will ask ourselves from time to time — *Why did you falter*? It must always be asked upon examination after a lapse. It should be asked on occasion because, as everyone knows, the unexamined life is not worth living. So, look at your lapses and ask: Why did I doubt?

In the Gospel account, the faltered attempt to walk on water took Peter down. Had Jesus not stretched out his hand to catch him, Peter would have sunk. But why did he falter? Why did he doubt? Apparently, it was his lack of faith. Walking on water is not a normal routine for anyone. When you stop to examine the possibility carefully, doubts engulf you right away. Without faith, it can't be done.

Faith is a precondition of discipleship. It is a condition of entry into companionship with Jesus. You can't just sign up — get your membership card, so to speak — and join the club. No, you make a commitment from within; you align your will with what you believe to be the will of God for you, and you move forward on what can only be called a journey of faith.

This journey, for most Catholics starts from infancy at baptism. As for myself, who made this choice to *join the club* came in the form of RCIA when I was 21 years old. But there has to be a confirmation — a recommitment — somewhere along the line. For most of us, it is a sacramental confirmation early on. It could be an adult recommitment, a conscious reconnection with the Lord, a conscious choice to realign your will with that of God, to pattern your life on the life of Christ, to follow a path that is not so clear, to search for light that is not always there.

The journey of faith requires that you not be a passive participant, along for the ride. You've got choices to make about direction and destination, about speed and duration, about companions along the way. The journey of faith requires activity of you — human activity — activity of mind and heart; it requires acts of faith, and hope, and love.

The Sunday liturgy is a good setting to inquire about your faltering on the journey of faith. You hear God's word here. You gather with fellow believers around the table of the Lord. You remember your Lord in the breaking of the bread. You give thanks. Your receive Eucharistic nourishment for the next stage of your journey of faith. You also have quiet moments to reflect on where your journey is taking you, which is to say, what directions and distances your free choices will take you, as you continue to follow Christ in the week ahead.

Not all of us find God easily in the words from scripture that are proclaimed in the Eucharistic assembly. Not all of us are sufficiently attentive when the word is proclaimed; not all are prepared to receive it. Not all of us show forth Christ adequately to one another as we gather around the Altar; it is not always easy to locate Christ in our midst. You'll remember that Jesus said whenever two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in their midst. Well, it is sometimes difficult to find Jesus here in our midst. Think about the priests when at the altar in the person of Christ to offer this sacrifice — this re-presentation of the sacrifice of Calvary — not all priests measure up adequately to their representative responsibility. And although they surely — and I do mean all of them — believe that Jesus is present during the sacrifice, truly present body and blood, soul and divinity under the appearance of bread and wine, they falter a bit in their watery walk of faith even here in the liturgy.

So lets return to the Gospel story for another moment. The story begins with Jesus insisting that his disciples pile into the boat; off they go as he slips away to pray before walking around to the other side of the lake where he will meet the boat at View this bulletin online at www.DiscoverMass.com



the shore. He remained alone to pray. About what? We have no way of knowing. We can assume that he prayed for them. We can assume that he prayed for us. We just don't know. We do know that he united himself somehow — mind and heart — with his Father and the Holy Spirit.

The disciples huddled in the boat — what did they discuss? We don't know. We can assume that they talked about the miracle they had witnessed — the multiplication of the loaves and fishes, the miraculous feeding of thousands of people. They had to wonder about the power of this Jesus whom they were following and about the future of the movement he was launching. They were part of that movement, but where was it going, where would they wind up.

The gospel story indicates that a storm stirred up. The boat was being tossed by the waves for the wind was against it. Then Jesus came toward them walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. It is a ghost, they said, and they cried out in fear. At once Jesus spoke to them: Take courage! It is 1. Do not be afraid! Peter said to him in reply, Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.

Notice the *if*. There is doubt, not faith, ini the midst of all the fright, but notice also that doubt does not disqualify you from the community of believers. And Jesus said, *Come!*

So here we are, back where we began. Why did you doubt? Jesus provided the answer before he asked the question: How little faith you have!

Those words apply to us, as we return back to our liturgical remembrance, as we resume our respective journeys of faith. How little faith each one of us has. How much we depend on Jesus to encourage and instruct us, indeed to feed us with his sacred body and blood to keep us surefooted and strong on our respective journeys of faith.

A request for more silence in our church before and after the Mass I would like to ask all church attendants in our parish to observe a time of silence before and after our Sunday Masses. I am also responding to the comments from our parishioners requesting it. I think that we need to do more about silent respect of the Blessed Sacrament in our church. Pope Benedict, when the newest version of the Missal Book was printed in 2011, asked Catholics around the world to observe more silent moments during the Holy Mass, like after the readings or after the Holy Communion. The Holy Father wanted to encourage us to reflect in silence on the mysteries of Christ's presence among us. He also wanted to direct our attention to the private, spiritual moments of encounter with Christ in the Eucharist. I would like to remember his instruction and remind myself and everyone else in our Church congregation of it, especially this year when we undertake the Eucharistic revival in our parish.

Our Universal Church, which currently debates the synodal way of life, advocates the subject of "listening" to others in the Church rather than "telling" others. So, if we can learn how to listen better to others, we can also learn how to show our reverence to the presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

This is especially important when we are made aware of our relatively small church building. Very often, when we come to our church and want to deepen ourselves into silent adoration of the Divine Presence, we often hear somebody talking and we are disturbed. Our church is small and doesn't have any spare space where parishioners could stop and talk to each other. Any two or more people talking to each other in any place in our church affects other church attendants.

I need to say here: *mea culpa* (my fault) because I catch myself doing it even in front of the Tabernacle, which should be the most respected place in the church. Sometimes when a person approaches me, instead of taking them to the Sacristy, I talk to them right there. Our Tabernacle is located in what I call: the busiest church traffic point in St. Martha's church and requires the highest liturgical attention. The clergy and all members of our liturgical ministries like Sacristans, Altar Servers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors, Ashers, Cantors and Musicians need to avoid making unnecessary conversations in the church and especially in front of the Tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is kept.

In the Year of the parish Eucharistic revival, we become more aware and renew our faith in the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. We also try

to spend the time before and after Mass on private prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament. We are encouraged to spend time on silent adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Very often I see people kneeling behind the Tabernacle or even in front of it trying to say prayers.

I would like to ask that in our church building before or after the Mass we all refrain from unnecessary conversations and that the reverence of the Blessed Sacrament be observed by everyone. May God bless us all in this effort!




