Sunday Sermon – 24th Sunday of Ordinary Time

From Deacon Vern Sermon Dear Parishioners of St. Martha,

How often must I forgive?

- For as the heavens are high above the earth,
- So surpassing is his kindness toward those who fear him.
- As far as the east is from the west,
- So far as he put our transgressions from us.

These words, taken from the 103rd psalm, outline the dimensions of God's mercy. How great is it? As high as the heavens are above the earth, as wide as the east is from the west. These are the dimensions of God's forgiveness. Savor the words. Let them give you peace of heart. Let them fill your soul with trust. Be grateful for the forgiveness you have received. That's why you are here today, to give thanks for the forgiveness God has given you.

In today's Gospel, Peter asks Jesus: Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? Jesus replies in multiples — not seven times but seventy-seven times. And then Jesus tells a story about a generous master who is moved with compassion and forgives a servant's loan. But the one whose obligation to repay was forgiven, himself becomes a creditor and refuses to forgive his fellow servant who happens to owe him money. On hearing of his hard-heartedness, his refusal to forgive, his master turns him over to torturers, and Jesus, who is telling this story, says to all of us who will hear hit down through the centuries, So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart.

This is a serious and demanding doctrine. Whoever said that being a Christian, a follower of Christ, a believer in Christ, was going to be easy? One of the first lessons you must learn and put into practice, if you are going to be a good Christian, is the lesson of forgiveness. Is it possible that hidden somewhere in your heart or mind today is a block, a bolder, a weight that can be nothing else but a refusal to forgive? Is the pull of evil at work within us today, holding us back from forgiving others as we have been forgive?

Let me invite you today to take a visual walk with me along the Way of the Cross. You see the stations on the walls of our Church. You see Jesus condemned to death. You see him shouldering the cross, falling, being stripped, scourged, nailed to the cross and hung there to die. There are indeed three stations of consolation: Veronica wipes his face; Simon of Cyrene helps to carry the cross; he finds his mother Mary standing at the foot of the cross. But there he is unjustly condemned, hanging on the cross, suffering, waiting to die. And a soldier pierces his side with a lance. Blood and water flow out symbols of baptism and the Eucharist, sacraments of life and reconciliation.

There is a temptation to quantify forgiveness as Peter tried to do, but Jesus' point is that forgiveness is not about quantity — the number of times we extend forgiveness to another. In the parable the king's forgiveness is like God's forgiveness, and it transforms us, helping us to be as forgiving as God. The lesson is clear: If we hoard God's mercy while showing no mercy to others, we risk forfeiting the effects of God's mercy in our lives.

can imagine by seeing how far high the sky is above the earth, and how far the east is from the west. And remember that unpleasant prospects await you *unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart.*

We will hold the chain of Rosaries in St. Martha's church on October




