# From Our Pastor, Father George

## December 3, 2023

Sunday Sermon – First Sunday of Advent From Father George

## Dear Parishioners of St. Martha,

Today's reading from Isaiah speaks about the cry of the people for the Lord to return. Isaiah says: *Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down, with the mountains quaking before you.* He speaks about the second Coming of the Lord, which will manifest itself for everyone to see. This second coming of Jesus is the subject of the first part of Advent. All readings and prayers during this time will direct our minds and hearts to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. The Advent Latin classic: *Rorate coeli desuper et nubes pluant justum* asks heavens to *Drop down dew, from above, and let the clouds rain the just.* Another advent classic sings in Aramaic language: Marana-tha, Lord, come. They help us to pray for what our Christian Creed professes: *He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.* 

While later in Advent, we will prepare ourselves to celebrate the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered. We switch our attention and our advent prayers and resolutions to prepare us well to celebrate Christmas. Our top hymn of this time is going to be: *O come, o come, Emmanuel,* which sings: *Rejoice, rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you O Israel.* It will use the so called: Great Antiphons like: O Wisdom, O Adonai, O stock of Jesse, O key of David, O Rising Sun, O King, O Immanuel to inspire us to remember the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem and what meaning it had and it has for us today

When we hear Jesus telling his disciples to be on their guard and stay awake, we understand that he tells them to raise their souls to God, who will satisfy their needs. His today's: **Stay awake** - tells us to raise our souls to God, who will satisfy our needs. In the Gospel reading he compares those who are to be on their guard and stay awake to a - Doorkeeper — in clean clothes, elegantly dressed, ready to welcome the Lord with uplifted spirit, and our soul raised up to God.

Brothers and Sisters, Prophet Isaiah said: *We were all like men unclean, all that integrity of ours like filthy clothing*. Let's raise our souls to God, have our hope in God who reigns, put elegant clothes on ourselves, meaning - renew our faith in God, raise the standard of our manners, be on our guard and stay awake. The time of celebration is coming. Our hopes will be fulfilled


# RESPECT LEFE

#### **Abortion Preeminent Issue for U.S. Bishops**

At their Plenary Fall meeting November 15, the U.S. Bishops approved an amendment reaffirming that opposition to abortion is their preeminent priority ahead of the 2024 elections because it directly attacks our most vulnerable and voiceless brothers and sisters and destroys more than a million lives per year in our country alone. This amendment passed with an overwhelming 225 votes in favor and 11 opposed. The amendment is part of their document: Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship.

In the words of Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore, vice president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops: It's not simply a public policy issue. It is a deeply, deeply pastoral issue of loving the morns in need, helping them bring their babies to term, and then providing them with what they need to move forward.


