From Our Pastor, Father George December 10, 2023

Sunday Sermon — John The Baptist - The Voice Preparing The Way for the Coming of the Mightier One

From Fr. Jan Rykala SAC

Dear Parishioners of St. Martha,

During my missionary work in New Guinea, the road leading to one of my 10 churches was badly damaged by the rainy season. It was almost non-passable. I was asking my parishioners from that area to come and work on the road so I could easily arrive to the church to celebrate Sunday mass but they did not do it, so I stopped saying mass in their village because I didn't want to ruin my car which was already old and easily might break down. It seemed that they didn't care. After some time, one of their church leaders appeared in my office asking: One of our village leaders died and we want you to celebrate his funeral and burial at our church! I answered that the road is non-passable and I cannot come! He said: Father, our villagers were working few days on the road and it is in

good shape so you can come! Indeed, the road was much better than before so I came to the village and celebrated the funeral. After I finished, I told them: For Jesus who comes always among us when we celebrate the Sunday or daily Eucharist. You didn't want to fix the road but for your leader who died you did. Think about it a little: who is more important: Jesus or your village leader?

Spiritually, we Catholics in many ways are like those villagers in New Guinea! We can do a lot of things to meet famous people, sport or movie stars, to achieve difficult goals in our careers, we can

sacrifice money or even health to get to certain levels of living or social status but to do something more difficult or demanding to prepare the way for The Lord, to deepen our relationship with God or greater love or knowledge of Him we are not too willing.

The time of advent, which is the time of getting ready for the three way coming of Jesus into our lives: He comes everyday to meet us in the persons of other people, circumstances of our or others lives; He will finally come back one day to judge the living and the dead at Parousia; He came already 2000 years ago in Bethlehem and we celebrate this mystery at Christmas. He can come into our lives only if He finds the smooth, good road between Himself and our hearts.

John The Baptist calls us as he called the people of Juda and Jerusalem to repent of our sins, meaning fix the road for Jesus to come to save us: remove the mountains or hills of our pride and other sins which have its source in this one of the main or grievous sins and to fill our valleys with trust in God's faithful love Who always comes to heal, support, comfort, lead and simply to be with us always.


RESPECT LIFE

Abortion Preeminent Issue for U.S. Bishops

At their Plenary Fall meeting November 15, the U.S. Bishops approved an amendment reaffirming that opposition to abortion is their preeminent priority ahead of the 2024 elections because it directly attacks our most vulnerable and voiceless brothers and sisters and destroys more than a million lives per year in our country alone. This amendment passed with an overwhelming 225 votes in favor and 11 opposed. The amendment is part of their document: Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship.

In the words of Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore, vice president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops: It's not simply a public policy issue. It is a deeply, deeply pastoral issue of loving the moms in need, helping them bring their babies to term, and then providing them with what they need to move forward.


