From Our Pastor, Father George

March 24, 2024 - Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord From Deacon Vern Smith

Dear Parishioners of St. Martha,

In the readings for this Easter Sunday, from Acts of the Apostles, Peter establishes his credentials as a witness to the risen Christ by saying that he ate and drank with Jesus after Jesus returned to life from death on the cross. There is something about eating and drinking with another person that puts one on a practical level of believability. Peter didn't simply say he saw Jesus, or that he talked to him, or that others told him that they had seen Jesus. No, he said he had real down-to-earth contact with Jesus. He ate and drank with him. Ghosts do not eat and drink. Jesus is alive; he has truly risen. Peter knows, and therefore Peter is a reliable witness. We all enjoy eating and drinking companionship with others every day. And if you mentioned to someone that you ate and drank with someone else whom they know, they have every reason to believe that the other person is alive and well and in circulation. That's exactly the point Peter wanted to make. Shortly after Jesus died on the cross, the power of God made him alive and well again and put him back in circulation — a new kind of circulation, to be sure, we call it the risen life, but a seeable, touchable circulation that is real. And if you accept the witness of Peter, if you believe that Jesus died And rose again, you will, as Peter put it, "receive forgiveness of sins through his name." So it is important that there be witnesses, like Peter, to the resurrection so that others might believe and, believing, gain eternal life.

The liturgy of the Word on this Easter Sunday invites all of us to believe — to renew and deepen our belief in the risen Lord — and the reality that we celebrate today invites us all to become witnesses in our own time and in our own way to the risen Christ. Our lives, as disciples of Christ, should witness to the reality of the resurrection. That can be done in a variety of ways, but the way I would offer for your consideration today is the simple eating-and-drinking style of witness. You eat and drink with others every day. I'm suggesting that those others can see in you some of the values Jesus embodied, some of the lessons Jesus taught. So much of what Jesus said and did was ordinary. True, the miraculous and truly extraordinary event of the resurrection brought him back to life, but the life to which he returned is the eating-and-drinking kind of ordinary life you live every day. In you — leading that life every day — others can see Jesus. They can see the kind, caring, thoughtful, generous Jesus in you, in your kindness, your caring, your thoughtfulness, your generosity. Peter was, as I said, a reliable witness. How reliable are you, how reliable am I in witnessing to the risen Jesus?

We don't have to talk about it all the time. We just have to believe and live as if we did indeed believe. Our lives as believers will be qualitatively different from the lives of those who have no faith — those who, even if they heard, do not vet believe. The problem of unbelief is an enormous one in our day — these many centuries after the fact of the resurrection. We cannot be content not to do anything about it. But doing something about it does not necessarily mean preaching or even persuading. It does, however, mean living our ordinary lives - our eating-and-drinking existence - differently because of the resurrection. It first means living gratefully. How can we not be grateful for the gift of faith that came to us through the death and resurrection of Jesus? And how can we contemporary Catholics, who no longer show up for Mass on Sundays, have missed the obvious connection between the Holy Thursday institution of the Eucharist and the Easter Sunday resurrection? We live gratefully because we've been redeemed by the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. We show our gratitude liturgically — that is, we declare ourselves to be much obliged — every Sunday, and Sunday is Resurrection Day, the first day of the week when we give our thanks in the celebration of the Eucharist.

And those with whom we eat and drink on any day of the week, those who see us living gratefully in our ordinary daily lives, will see something not just different, but something enormously attractive, and they might — just might,

by the grace of God — begin to think about that difference and wonder why. When that happens, we are witnessing, just as Peter witnessed, to the resurrection.

The very thought of being or becoming an ingrate is both frightening and abhorrent when introduced into this Easter consideration. As believers, we have learned the resurrection lesson that death's not what we're moving toward; it's what we're coming from!

Ingrates no more, all we can be is grateful as we walk away now from this Holy Week Triduum more determined than ever to live gratefully every day of the year. The Lord has risen *Alleluia*, *Alleluia*.

When Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina on April 30, 2000, he surprised everyone by proclaiming that throughout the world the Second Sunday of Easter will receive the name Divine Mercy Sunday. He called the new feast day an invitation to Christians to face with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come. The Pope went on to declare, This is the happiest day of my life.

We ask God to raise our Dead to everlasting life! - The time of Easter is the time to pray for our Deceased. We believe that Jesus, after his death on the cross, reached the deepest abyss to call the dead and raised them to eternal life. Through his resurrection he has opened the gate of eternal life. May all the Faithful Departed rest in peace!

Next Sunday (April 7, 2024) is the Second Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy).



The first requirement is 50% attendance at Sunday Mass for the year. To confirm your attendance, please place your offertory envelope in the basket during the offertory collection (an offertory contribution of at least a quarter should be included in the envelope).

The second requirement is participation in at least one parish ministry.




