January 4, 2026 - The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord by Deacon Vern

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord — a feast whose very name means manifestation. It is the day we recall how Jesus, the newborn King, was revealed not only to Israel but to the whole world, symbolized by the visit of the Magi from the East.

The Gospel tells us that these wise men followed a star, a light in the darkness, which led them to Bethlehem. They came from far away, crossing deserts and enduring hardships, because they were searching for something — or rather, Someone. Their journey reminds us that faith is often a pilgrimage: it requires patience, perseverance, and a willingness to leave behind what is comfortable in order to encounter God.

The Magi brought gifts — gold, frankincense, and myrrh — each carrying deep meaning:

- Gold for a King, acknowledging Christ's sovereignty.
- Frankincense for God, recognizing His divinity.
- Myrrh for one who would suffer and die, pointing to the mystery of the Cross.

But perhaps the greatest gift they offered was not in their hands, but in their hearts: their worship. They knelt before the Child and adored

Him. This is the essence of the Epiphany — to recognize Jesus as Lord and to give Him our lives.

In our own time, God still places stars in our path — moments, people, and events that guide us toward Him. The question is: are we watching the skies of our lives? Are we willing to follow where He leads, even if it takes us beyond our comfort zones?

Like the Magi, we are

called to return *by another way* — not just geographically, but spiritually. An encounter with Christ changes our direction. It transforms our priorities, our relationships, and our mission in the world.

So today, let us bring our own gifts to the Lord:

- The **gold** of our love and fidelity.
- The **frankincense** of our prayer and praise.
- The myrrh of our sacrifices and sufferings, united to His.

May we, like the Magi, be seekers of the Light, bearers of the Light, and witnesses to the Light — until the day when we see Him face to face.


Magi from the East offered the gifts of gold, which pointed at Jesus as the


The Legacy Society at St Martha is open to all parishioners. There is no financial donation required to join, only the commitment to leave something — anything — to St Martha in your will.





Many of us wonder how we can help. Should we give a few dollars to those suffering? 90% of our homeless suffer from addiction and/or mental illness. Giving cash enables the continuation of the homeless lifestyle.

But what about our duty as Christians to help the poor and needy?

Aren't we supposed to help? YES, absolutely! But please let your donation truly do the good you intend. The church collects money to support our local homeless charities. The Homeless Outreach donation box is located near the main doors of the church. The monies collected go to:

Caritas Food Pantry: A parish ministry at St. Martha. The food pantry is open Monday-Friday and serves hundreds of families every week.

Resurrection House: Provides many free services to the homeless including breakfast, lunch, bathrooms, showers, toiletries, laundry service , clothing, chapel, barber, health screening, medical doctor, dentist, vaccines, and legal services.

Family Promise: An organization addressing the gap in local services for pregnant mothers experiencing homelessness. Expectant mothers and their children can be housed at the Family Promise Francis House or Family Promise funding housing. Family Promise currently houses 39 pregnant mothers with children.

The Homeless Outreach donation box is the way to truly help. Placing your donations in the box will make a real difference.


